Jesus Taught With Parables

"With many such parables he spoke the word to them, as they were able to hear it. He did not speak to them without a parable, but privately to his own disciples he explained everything" (Mk. 4:33-34).

Mark tells us Jesus taught with many parables and never taught without a parable. Why? God created us, and He knows how our mind works. He knows the special role stories play in our learning. Learning becomes easier when the problem is presented in a story. For some, a math problem described in X's and Y's might as well be in Chinese. But if you tell about a man with a pile of bricks and a big hole, it's believable. The abstract becomes real. The invisible becomes visible. The problem is still hard, but it becomes clearer when illustrated.

So when an invisible truth is laid beside a visible truth that's similar, we make a connection. When we see a hen put her chicks under her for protection, we can understand a little bit about the way God loves us. It might still be a reach, but it becomes possible. Children learn life lessons from Aesop's Fables. The point is not that a fox can talk, but that greed is foolish. So in His parables, Jesus taught us we can get more out of a mustard seed than mustard or more out of yeast than bread. By pointing out the similarities between the familiar and the unknown, we learn about the unknown. Even if the characters did not actually exist, the story teaches you a truth. So there are lessons to be learned from a hen and her chicks or ants building a mound.

The Bible is full of parables, and Jesus never taught without using parables. Why is that? The point is not just presenting facts to man. The point of teaching is getting the hearer to learn, believe, and obey from the heart. God is not willing that anyone perish. Many will, but not without doing everything possible to save us. He continues to call us and uses everything from Jupiter to Calvary to get our attention. So Jesus used parables. He never spoke without them.
