Monetary donations will also be welcome and will be used to pick up the perishable items closer to the date the hampers are wrapped and packed.

December 14th—White Gift Sunday—Bring your food items and gifts to the Church. Following the service we will bring everything to the Hall. Assistance will be needed to sort everything from 11:30 am until about 2:00 pm.

December 15th—Wrapping, sorting, and packaging—Assistance will be required from 9:00am until about noon. Come enjoy a morning of Christmas carols and wrapping! A great way to get into the spirit!

December 16th—Delivery day—Assistance will be required in the morning for delivery.

We have 20 children to buy gifts for this year! They range in age from 6 months to 16 years old. There will be a sign up sheet for gifts that has some present ideas. Our elves are currently collecting these ideas so please stay tuned. The Christmas Cheer Board suggests gifts of no more than \$25.

MISSION AND MINISTRY

Here is a look at what has happened and what is coming up in the next few months:

Bulletin Board - Located in the Parish Hall for information on and updates on the organizations that we are active in. Alongside Hope (formerly PWRDF), collecting stamps, glasses and hearing aids, West End 24, and 1JustCity are but a few of our ongoing projects! A listing of our ministries can be found on our Website under Mission & Ministry.

Foster Child through Plan International Canada - We continue to support our foster child, Hantz-Michael through donations collected at Coffee Hour. Get to know him by checking out the framed biography on display! Watch in the bulletin for updates on collection amount.

1JustCity - Under 1JustCity we support the Pimicikamak Wellness Centre as well as other initiatives. Grace McKay and Pam Bann are the St. Andrew's contact for the Pimicikamak Wellness Centre site of 1JustCity. They deliver food and hygiene items donated by our parishioners on a regular basis for use of folks accessing this drop-in center's hot lunch and programming opportunities available 4 days per week

Christmas Orange Campaign - In the spirit of the upcoming season, your Mission & Ministry Committee is focusing to bring a little bit of Christmas to marginalized Winnipeggers in our inner-city area. As the mandate of 1JustCity's West Broadway site has recently changed, we are planning this year to provide our Christmas gift of Mandarin Oranges to folks who are supported by 1JustCity's drop-in site at the Pimicikamak Wellness Centre (the former Balmoral Hotel). This site provides hot lunches followed by programming options daily, Monday to Thursday. Our plan is to deliver boxes of oranges each Monday morning, for the first 3 weeks in December. Thanks to your generous donations, we provided 72 boxes of oranges for distribution to our less fortunate neighbours in Winnipeg's inner-city area last December! St Andrews is well known as the "Church who gives the oranges".

Arocha - St Andrews has put this ministry on hold for the interim, as we will focus on more "Green" initiatives in the future. We welcome anyone's suggestions for future ideas.

Alongside Hope - The need remains great. Grow Hope is helping to fill a devastating funding gap left by the cuts to USAID. These cuts are having a major impact on our partner, Church World Service. Recently, over 750 staff in Kenya had to be laid off, resulting in the near closure of their refugee resettlement program. Despite these difficulties, organizations like CWS continue to work to provide essential services for those in need. During a recent Canadian Foodgrains Bank visit to the Marsabit Project that Grow Hope is supporting, a participant shared a powerful reflection: "The food you provided gave us hope; the seed and tools you are providing allow us to grow hope." This profound statement captures the essence of the Grow Hope initiative: planting seeds of hope for a brighter future. There is still time to take part in this vital campaign! Fred Wiebe and his sons are willing to donate the proceeds from however many acres we can support with our fundraising. Our support for input costs for one acre are only \$300. Please encourage your parish to participate in this year's campaign and continue to invite parishioners to donate directly.

MISSION AND MINISTRY (continued)

Loving Hands - Our Loving Hands ministry supports West End 24 as well as the West Broadway Youth Program. Once again our congregation's support was dearly appreciated. We were able to make 15 female and 15 male bags containing items such as toothpaste, deodorant, and soaps, and with the gracious donation from our knitters and crocheters we were able to provide hats and mitts in each bag. All other knit/crocheted items will be donated to Agape Table, Food Bank and Rossbrook House. Some extra household items from our Rummage sale have also been donated to West End 24 as they assist in placing people in temporary housing.

Postage Stamps – Doreen Pattie has taken over the donation of Postage Stamps. She delivered one bundle of stamps to Charleswood United Church. They have a 'stamp person' who picks up the stamps and as he is knowledgeable, submits those of interest to auction. The money raised from this supports CUN's outreach program. This year they supported Willow Place, 1JustCity, Days for Girls, Charleswood schools, wildfire refugees and others. Last year, the stamps raised \$500. We feel this is a worthy place to take St Andrew's stamps as they have a process in place and a knowledgeable person to run the program. The person who was in the office where we took the stamps was very excited with the volume and was very grateful that St Andrew's is supporting this ministry.

Agape Table - Our dedicated group of volunteers continue to attend at Agape Table monthly where they chop meat and vegetables for the homemade soup, wrap pastries and sandwiches and fill the bags for distribution to the clients. Our last volunteer date for 2025 is Wednesday, December 17th from 7:00 am to 11:00 am. See the weekly bulletin for reminders and contact information should you wish to volunteer. We feel blessed to be part of such an amazing community working hard to help those less fortunate. Upcoming dates in the New Year are: Thursday, January 29th, Wednesday, February 25th and Wednesday, March 25th. Reminders will be posted in the Sunday Bulletins.

TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION



Some of us were able to take in the Truth and Reconciliation POW WOW at the Convention Center in September. We were in awe of the beautiful dress of many of the participants of all ages. We took some time to speak to some of the dancers about the ceremonial garb that was being worn and learned that each had a story to tell. We will share some of these stories in upcoming displays.

Our display at the back of the Church focused on Orange Shirt Day and on professional sports teams and their contribution to truth and reconciliation endeavors. Our Winnipeg Jets and the Winnipeg Blue Bombers are very involved in the movement towards truth and reconciliation – very commendable. Literature on the struggles aboriginal people in sports have to overcome is also available.

In November we were fortunate to have Reverend Canon Murray Still join us on in the Parish Hall. He shared infor-

mation on the church, indigenous issues and the Sacred Circle. Canon Murray Still traces his heritage from Peguis First Nation and has served as incumbent within our diocese in Winnipeg. He has served on many programs to assist those aged out of Child and Family Services. As board chair Murray has assisted in bringing a change in governance to accommodate the way we offer services - The four Justice programs—Open Circle, CoSA, Touchstone and El Da'ad Ranch. He has led workshops on Indige-

nous governance and self-determination and has been the mission developer of Rupert's Land-Wechetowin Inc. He is very involved in the Sacred Circle. Reverend Still has also provided training in restorative justice and has been instrumental in creating studies in Indigenous Spiritual and Pastoral Care at the University of Winnipeg Faculty of Theology. Thank you all for coming to hear Rev. Still share his views.

In Feb, Reverend Tanis Kolisnyk will join the Mission and Ministry meeting to speak about the work that Wechetowin does in our diocese. Another book club is also pending, stay tuned!

CANDIED PECANS

- -1 Cup White Sugar
- -2 tsp Cinnamon
- -1/2 tsp Salt
- -1 Egg White
- -2 tsp Cold Water
- -2 tsp Vanilla
- -4 Cups Pecan Halves

Preheat oven to 250°F. Combine sugar, cinnamon, and salt in a bowl. Combine egg white, cold water, and vanilla in a bowl, whisking until frothy. Stir pecan halves into the egg mixture to coat. Add the sugar mixture, and stir well. Spread in a single layer on a parchment-lined cookie sheet. Bake for one hour, stirring well every 20 minutes. Store in an air-tight container.
