



August and September 2025

Pastors and Prayer Partners,

It is hard to believe that we are four months into our furlough. We have been on the road quite a bit. We have visited our supporting churches in Ohio, Michigan, Kentucky, and Canada.

We are trying to raise some more support. Our support has dropped some. A couple of our supporting churches have dissolved. We have been able to pick up two new supporting churches, and we are praying that we can pick up another two or three.

I made an error in my last prayer letter, and I inadvertently gave my old phone number. **My new number is (803) 261-9764.** I am sorry if it caused any confusion.

The church in Ghana is continuing to do well. Bro. Gyan is holding down the fort for us while we are gone. I talk to him every week or two to see how things are going. They just had a baby dedication and naming ceremony this past Sunday. Little Kofi was born just a week or two before we left for furlough. Tonya and I were able to go to the hospital to pick them up and take them home.

We want to say thank you to the churches that sent in money for our retaining wall. We have received almost \$6,500.00 in donations for it. Approximately \$3,000 is still needed. So, Praise the Lord, we are now two-thirds of the way there! I talked to the builder last week, and he is supposed to get started very soon.

Please continue to pray for us and the Mount Moriah Baptist Church in West Anoe/Kojokrom, Ghana.

Dear Praying Partners,

I was thinking about that old song, Years of time are swiftly passing, bringing nearer Heaven's goal, soon I'll be at home with Jesus, while eternal ages roll. Time is surely passing very quickly, and the Lord tells us to ask Him to teach us to number our days that we may apply our hearts unto wisdom. (Ps. 90:12) If there was ever a time to number our days, it is NOW.

We thank the Lord for a busy two months! In September we were blessed to be in 4 facilities. with 14 men professing salvation. Sometimes we take for granted that we will just always get to go in to our prisons and jails, and also that we will have volunteers to go with us. The Lord is gracious to let us do this, and we don't ever want to forget to praise Him for all the opportunities He gives, We were able to hand out 54 inmate Bibles and 26 New Testaments that month, and to sign 31 offenders up for our Bible Study courses. Both of these are very important parts of discipling the offenders; thank God for this! Also, I went to the home office for a field staff meeting, and was able to attend a mission conference in September as well.

October brought many blessings and a few challenges. I had cataract surgery on both eyes; praise the Lord I'm doing really well and it is a blessing to see so much better! Kay had another procedure with her fistula, and so far, it is working well. God is so good to us.

God allowed us to go to 4 prisons/jails in October, and 30 souls were saved. 84 Bibles were given to the offenders, and 122 signed up for the Bible Study! Praise the Lord. Thank you for giving to our Bible account and to the Discipleship dept. to make this

possible. There is no better thing to invest in, than to disciple these men and ladies for the Lord.

At our last prison, we only got to do one service because of things going on there, but God knows and it did allow a day or two of rest after having the eye surgeries.

On our Rock of Ages Media Outreach, which are apps that the inmates can access on their tablets, called Edovo and Pando, to hear Bible lessons and messages from our missionaries, we got the following report: 50 messages have been uploaded to Edovo, and 8 messages each month on Pando. To date, there have been 100074 views, 9242 have subscribed to our content, and 211 have been saved. We have subscribers from 39 states, of which 25 states have reported salvations. What a great tool this is to get the gospel out to more inmates!

Thank you so much for your continued prayers and support. We do ask that you continue to remember a family member who is fighting cancer.. We want to wish you all a very Happy Thanksgiving and a Merry Christmas.

I love Christmas! I always have and always will. There is just something special about this most wonderful time of the year. From the time I was a child, Christmas was the one holiday that seemed to stand out from all the rest. Whether it was because of the homemade chocolate candy, the traditional breakfast on Christmas morning, or the countless stories that have come from thosedays gone by, Christmas is that occasion that reawakens thoughts and emotions like no other.

I can close my eyes and remember, with remarkable clarity, the chill that was in the air as we decorated the tree, opened the presents, and played with the toys. Our old farmhouse was adorned inside and out with lights, while the most delectable of smells emanating from the kitchen filled every room. It was truly, in so many ways, an old-fashioned, almost Rockwellian, Christmas. In my young mind, time even seemed to stand still every December 25th.

Reflecting on those times has caused me to revisit not only the sights and the smells, but also the sounds of Christmas. In our home, we had an old console stereo that was used most often during the month of December. Stacks of records were dusted off and set to play traditional carols of the season. Even now whenever I hear certain songs I am magically transported back to afar simpler time and to hours spent sitting on the rug in front of the fire. Perhaps that is why Christmas hymns hold such a special place in my heart. From "Hark, the Herald Angels" to "O, Come All Ye Faithful" to "Away in a Manger," these melodies deliver a soul-comforting warmth regardless of how dark and cold the world may be. Included in these familiar tunes would be a song written more than two centuries ago by Joseph Mohr. And even though we would sing it, we seldom, in the most tremendous of ways, had a "Silent Night;" at least not at our house.

With all due respect given to Mohr and to composer Franz Gruber, I am not so sure that the first Christmas night was quiet at all. Think about it with me for a moment. Whether we allow our minds to explore the activities of the shepherds, the angels, the Wisemen, or the small family from Nazareth; there was much excitement and, subsequently, a considerable amount of noise. Do not forget that Bethlehem was overcrowded with people having made their way to the city of their birth because of Caesar and histax. Consider that a hillside outside of that little town was the gathering place of shepherds and their flocks. Remember also that the Wisemen, living perhaps in Persia, were undoubtedly elated when the new star appeared, announcing the arrival of the One born King of the Jews. And never overlook the fact that in that hollowed-out cave, on the outskirts of Bethlehem, there were the sounds of a mother giving birth to the Savior of the World and His first cry as it echoed throughout the very world that He had created

More than two thousand years have come and gone since that glorious night, and while there is much that can and should be said about the actions of reverence and stillness when we are in the presence of the One that was wrapped in swaddling clothes and laid in a manger; I am convinced that we have adopted a mentality that has silenced the joy that should be proclaimed, loudly even, to a lost and dying world. Truly the shepherds were filled with the wonder of it all and began to make known what they had seen and heard. Somehow, I can't see them whispering this good news. The Wisemen began to make plans for a journey that would take them two years to complete. A multitude of the Heavenly host return to glory still in awe at the sight of The Son of Godcoming to earth as a baby. And that young family of three must have been weeping tears of happiness and thanksgiving for all of God's blessings.

So now, what about us? Are we guilty of turning the most blessed birth in the history of the universe into moments of quiet contemplation when it should be shouted from the rooftops? Has the hustle and bustle of such a hectic time of the year silenæd our voices that should be raised in song and testimony? Have we overly embraced a calm demeanor instead of proclaiming the joyful news that is for all people? In our attempt to be reverent let us never ignore the examples of those on that first Christmasnight. And let us resolve to declare to others the change that has taken place in our lives because of what happened when the One that was born to die became alive in our hearts.

For the time is soon coming when we will step from the quietest world in which we have ever lived to a place filled with endless praise. There will never again be a Silent Night in that land that knows no night; for it is one eternal day made brightby the glory of The Daystar from on High.
