

Lighting of the Advent Wreath


In a world full of fear, where do you see glimmers of joy?

Confession and Forgiveness






Second Reading: Ephesians 4:1-6

The virgin's name was Mary. ²⁸ And he came to her and said, "Greetings, favored one! The Lord is with you." ^[2] But she was much perplexed by his words and pondered what sort of greeting this might be. ³⁰ The angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God. ³¹ And now, you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. ³² He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will

give to him the throne of his ancestor David. ³³ He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end." ³⁴ Mary said to the angel, "How can this be, since I am a virgin?" ^[5] ³⁵ The angel said to her, "The Holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you; therefore the child to be born ^[5] will be holy; he will be called Son of God. ³⁶ And now, your relative Elizabeth in her old age has also conceived a son, and this is the sixth month for her who was said to be barren. ³⁷ For nothing will be impossible with God." ³⁸ Then Mary said, "Here am I, the servant of the Lord; let it be with me according to your word." Then the angel departed from her.



For no matter how big, or how small, we trust that you are a calling, inviting, nudging, inspiring God who sees us in the best light.



Friends, did you ever have a moment growing up when you walked into the school cafeteria, panned the faces in the crowd, and wondered if you were going to have a place to sit?


Did you ever have a moment, maybe as a new student or new employee, when fear nibbled at the back of your mind because you weren't sure where you belonged?


who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever and ever. Amen.


Prayer after Communion
