
December Fundraising Objective

During the second week of December, contributions totaled \$16,852. This amount brings the cumulative donations for the month to \$31,273. In order to meet the approved budget for 2025, the congregation must raise a total of \$123,554 in December.

Progress toward this fundraising goal is illustrated on the thermometer graphic located to the right. At this point, with two weeks remaining in December, only 25% of the goal has been reached.

Contribution Deadlines for Tax Deduction:

To ensure eligibility for a 2025 tax deduction, all contributions must be received by December 31. If you are mailing your donation, please make sure it is postmarked no later than December 31.



These are some basic highlights and general information. For more specific questions please contact the Eligibility Team at elegible@bloodworksnw.org or call 425-656-3077 option one.

HOW TO PREPARE FOR BLOOD DONATION APPOINTMENT

- Hydrate by drinking plenty of fluids for 24 hours
- Eat salty snacks the night before
- Get a good night's rest
- Eat a good breakfast (or lunch depending on app't time)
- Bring picture ID
- Fill out Quickpass at time of appointment (a health questionnaire).

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

- Should have generally good health and be feeling well day of appointment
- Plan to undergo a confidential screening interview and mini health check of blood pressure, pulse, temp, and iron level.
- Not everyone is eligible to donate. Some factors are health conditions, meds, or recent travel. Again check link and phone number as noted above for specifics.
- Consider also checking in with your healthcare provider.

WEIGHT REQUIREMENTS:

• At least 110 pounds

AGE REQUIREMENTS

- 18 years. No upper age limit
- 16 and 17 year olds can donate with permission forms, provided by Bloodworks NW. Parent or guardian must sign.

Hopelink has asked us to collect **baby items during December**. They are in **desperate need** of **baby wipes**. They have diapers for their clients but regularly have no wipes. So, their biggest need is baby wipes (and baby food).

*(Note: Check the expiration dates. Hopelink is legally required to throw away any expired baby food or formula.)









Holden Village Evacuated: The Holden Village community has closed temporarily following a series of mudslides on FS 8301. Transport to and from the Village is currently unavailable. All Villagers have been evacuated. A small crew of 11 staff will stay behind to finish winterizing the Village and prepare Village systems to be shut down. The Village is well stocked and the leave behind crew will be able to remain in the Village for an extended time if needed.

The road damage occurred on Wednesday night after four consecutive days of heavy rain. FS 8301, the only road linking Holden Village with the boat dock at Lucerne, is currently impassable. Because of the continued danger of

mudslides as well as pending avalanche risks as precipitation turns to snow for the winter, reconstruction work cannot safely begin until spring 2026. This closure is expected to last at least through May 2026. Incoming guests are being notified of changes to their reservations.

THANK YOU to those who have reached out to the Village to offer support for the evacuated staff. Temporary housing has been secured!
