You are here to change this place and us. We are not afraid.



### Perhaps dawn has come to fill every corner of the room with sunlight.


Or, we have grown so familiar with our surroundings that we can find our way without sight.


# Or, the person we have longed to know now rests by our side, peacefully breathing.
