

CHALKING THE DOORS FOR EPIPHANY

What Is Chalking the Door?

During Epiphany-tide (the church season following 6th January) the faithful and friends gather at the main entrances to homes, places of work, and places of worship to ask God's blessing on their dwellings and on all who live or visit there.

In Deuteronomy 6:9 God tells the people of Israel: "These words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house... You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates." In this service, we mark our doors with chalk as a sign that we have invited God's presence and blessing into our homes

What Do the Numbers and Letters Mean?

The first and last numbers simply refer to the current year. The letters C M B come from the traditional names for the three kings: Caspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. Some also suggest it stands for "Christus Mansionem Benedicat" which means, "May Christ bless this dwelling!"

How To Do It

Any time on or after Epiphany, find some chalk and gather everyone around the door. Pray together using the following liturgy and use the chalk, taking turns if you'd like, to make the inscription above your door.

CHALKING THE DOOR

Leader Peace be to this house and to all who enter here. A reading from Proverbs: "By wisdom a house is built, and through understanding it is established; through knowledge its rooms are filled with rare and beautiful treasures."

Let us pray.

Gracious God, as a shining star once guided the magi to the birthplace of the infant Jesus, so enable those who meet here to be your light in the world; through Jesus Christ we pray.

All Amen.

Using chalk, we are invited to inscribe the lintel of the church and our homes with the inscription shown below. 20 + C + M + B + 26

The three Wise Men, [C] Caspar, [M] Melchior, and [B] Balthasar followed the star to Bethlehem and the child Jesus [20] two thousand and [26] twenty-six years ago. [+ +] May Christ bless this place [+ +] and remain with us throughout the new year. **Amen.**

Leader A reading from Isaiah: "The effect of righteousness is peace, and the result of righteousness, quietness and trust forever. My people will abide in a peaceful habitation, in secure dwellings, and quiet places."

Let us pray.

Sovereign God, we pray that you will bless this place, and all who abide here, with your gracious presence; that your love may be our inspiration, your wisdom our guide, your truth our light, and your peace our benediction; through Jesus Christ we pray.

All Amen.

Leader May the Lord watch over our going out and our coming in, from this time forth and forevermore.

All Amen.

At the church, the priest may conclude with a blessing and dismissal.

Priest Christ the Son of God perfect in you the image of his glory and gladden your hearts with the good news of his kingdom; and the blessing of God almighty, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, be among you and remain with you always.

All Amen.

Priest Let us go in peace to love and serve the Lord!
