Message from Rev. Wilson

O Oriens: O Dayspring - By Jacob A. Davis

"O Oriens: O Morning Star, splendour of light eternal and sun of righteousness: Come and enlighten those who dwell in darkness and the shadow of death.
cf. Malachi 4:2."

"December 21st arrives draped in shadow. In the Northern Hemisphere, it is often the winter solstice—the shortest day of the year, the long night when darkness seems, at last, to have won. It is no accident, then, that the Church places O Oriens—the fifth O Antiphon, in which we find Christ referred to as the "Dayspring," on the darkest day of the year" - Jacob A.

As we reflect on this season our Lord Jesus Christ and Saviour is near and from our Gospel reading this Sunday in Matthew 1:18-25, it reveals His extraordinary birth, fulfilling Isaiah's prophecy (7:14). Joseph's dream shows God's plan to save humanity through Jesus, the Messiah. Indeed, "Emmanuel, God with us" and this is for us to have a special time of reflection about God's presence, that is:

- Emmanuel reminds us God is with us in our joys, struggles, and uncertainties.
- Unexpected ways: Jesus' birth via a virgin conception shows God's power and humility.
- Faith and obedience: Joseph's trust in God's plan inspires us to surrender to God's will.

So as "Advent enters its final thematic phase anticipating the Nativity of Christ," we are invited to welcome Jesus, Emmanuel, into our lives and share His light in the world. Thanks be to God. Amen.
