Love: The Fourth Advent Candle

Reader 1: Today is the fourth Sunday in Advent. Through the prophets, God promised a Messiah. We are in awe of Jesus' birth – that God came to us this way, in a weak and vulnerable baby. The mighty God of the universe has become Emmanuel, "God with us."

Reader 2: The first Advent candle reminds us to have hope for a better world. (The first Advent candle is lit). The second Advent candle reminds us that God's dreams for peace can become real in our world. (The second Advent candle is lit).

Reader 1: The third Advent candle reminds us that God calls us to share joy by being part of the healing of the world. (*The third Advent candle is lit*). Today, we light the fourth Advent candle. It reminds us of God's promise to be with us and to love us, now and always. (*The fourth Advent candle is lit*).

All: Loving God, we thank you for your promise that you will be with us always. We rejoice in your faithfulness. Give us the courage to respond with the same love and compassion shown by Jesus. Amen.

Look, the young woman is with child and shall bear a son and shall name him Immanuel. He shall eat curds and honey by the time he knows how to refuse the evil and choose the good. Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus, called to be an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God, which he promised beforehand through his prophets in the holy scriptures, the gospel concerning his Son, who was descended from David according to the flesh and was declared to be Son of God with power according to the spirit of holiness by resurrection from the dead, Jesus Christ our Lord, through whom we have received grace and apostleship to bring about the obedience of faith among all the gentiles for the sake of his name, including you who are called to belong to Jesus Christ,

The Gospel (Matthew 1:18-25)

Celebrant: The Lord be with you. **People:** And also with you.

Celebrant: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew

Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be pregnant from the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to divorce her quietly. But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." All this took place to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet:

"Look, the virgin shall become pregnant and give birth to a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel,"

which means, "God is with us." When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife but had no marital relations with her until she had given birth to a son, and he named him Jesus.

People: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.
