

Life Group Study Questions Isaiah 53:1-12

- 1. Read Isaiah 53:1-12 together. As you think about this weekend's sermon, what stood out to you? What questions come to mind? Was there anything unclear or confusing?
- 2. There are 2 aspects to the word sacrifice. First, something of value is relinquished. Second, the purpose is to gain a greater good. Think of some examples of sacrifice. In your own life, have you had to sacrifice something?
- 3. Pastor Andrew's first point was "The Servant of the Lord defies people's expectations". Think through verses 1-3 of Isaiah 53 and how shocking the description would be. From what you know of Jesus' life and ministry, how did he defy people's expectations of the messiah?
- 4. Pastor Andrew's second point was "The Servant of the Lord gives himself as humanity's substitute". Read the following passages about sacrifices in the Old Testament:
 - Exodus 12:1-13
 - Leviticus 14:25

How do these passages held deepen our understanding of Jesus being called "The Lamb of God"?

- 5. Read the following passages in the New Testament where Jesus' sacrifice and blood are referred too:
 - 1 Corinthians 5:7-8
 - Ephesians 5:1-2
 - 1 Peter 1:18-19
 - 1 Peter 2:21-25
- 6. Pastor Andrew's third point was "The Servant of the Lord makes many to be counted righteous". Read Revelation 5:9-14 and talk about what the Lamb accomplished through his death.
