**Luke 2:8–10 (NLT)** "That night there were shepherds staying in the fields nearby... Suddenly, an angel of the Lord appeared... 'I bring you good news that will bring great joy to all people.'"

Shepherds were ordinary, overlooked people. God chose them to deliver the message of hope.

They didn't stay quiet—they ran and told everyone.

Shine Your Light

Matthew 5:16 (NLT) "You are the light of the world... let your good deeds shine out for all to see."

You don't need all the answers. You don't need a sermon. You just need to let Jesus be seen through you.
