Christmas Carol What Child Is This? verses 1 and 2 UMH 219

Lesson 1 Acts 17:22-34a God revealed in Creation

Our first reading tells of God, spreading time and space, and of ourselves, needing God, in a world gone wrong. Hear now the words of the Apostle Paul, who visits the Greek city of Athens, debates with philosophers, and proclaims the One true God.

Lesson 2 Psalm 146

Long before Jesus was born, God's Holy Name was revealed to the people of Israel. As descendants of Abraham, Christians, Muslims, and Jews worship One God but each have different stories. Our story as Christians is founded on the story of the Jews because Jesus expressed what his people already knew about God.

From the Psalms - songs of ancient Israel, we learn that God is not only awesome but also active 'not neutral, but involved' not a detached creator, but God among us, longing to see justice done and the humble lifted high.

Here ends our reading of the second lesson. Let us pray and work and hope for justice, kindness and 'peace on earth, goodwill to all'.

Lesson 3 The Birth of Jesus, Emmanuel Luke 2:1-8

We believe that in Jesus of Nazareth, the Great Holy One, creator of the universe, came to be with us, as one of us, not just to be seen and touched and known, but to do something, to make a difference: to us and to the whole world.

We shall hear how Jesus was born, what kind of person he became, and what his life reveals to us. The Gospel of Luke tells about Jesus' birth and who greeted him.

Forgive us, break us, bend us, remake us. Give us the courage to lay ourselves open to the wonder and healing of your coming. Be born again into our world, be born again into our hearts and lives. Hear now our silent and personal confessions as we prepare ourselves for your nativity.

Assurance of Pardon

The true light that enlightens all has come into the world. That light shines on in the darkness, and the darkness has never been able to put it out. This is the good news: God has heard our confession. God has forgiven our sin.

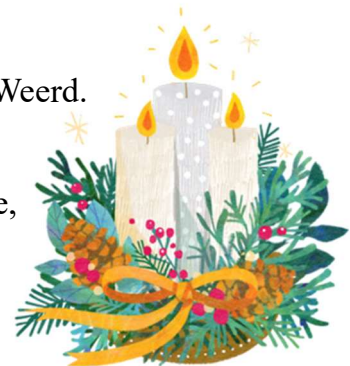
