Lesson 2 Psalm 146

Long before Jesus was born, God's Holy Name was revealed to the people of Israel. As descendants of Abraham, Christians, Muslims, and Jews worship One God but each have different stories. Our story as Christians is founded on the story of the Jews because Jesus expressed what his people already knew about God.

From the Psalms - songs of ancient Israel, we learn that God is not only awesome but also active 'not neutral, but involved' not a detached creator, but God among us, longing to see justice done and the humble lifted high.

The true light that enlightens all has come into the world. That light shines on in the darkness, and the darkness has never been able to put it out. This is the good news: God has heard our confession. God has forgiven our sin.
