## 2. Paul’s Concerns About the Church

Paul warns the Corinthian church against confusing spiritual experiences with spiritual maturity.

### Unclear worship:

- Alienates listeners
- Weakens families
- Damages witness

### Clear proclamation:

- Fosters believers
  - Convicts hearts
  - Magnifies Christ

## 3. The Language of Authority

Every language answers the same question: *Who has authority?*

- God’s Word creates disciples
- Cultural language creates consumers
