OVERVIEW



Join With All Creation In Celebrating The Birth Of Jesus

When Jesus was born there was joy on earth and in heaven. All of creation joined in celebrating this gift from God the Father. And we are invited to be a part of it.

Heaven and Nature Sing is an opportunity for your whole congregation to participate in praising and celebrating the birth of Jesus. Your participants will be challenged to adopt an attitude of praise and celebration through the following stories:

- *Gabriel's announcement to Mary
- *Mary's visit to Elizabeth
- *The angels announcing Jesus' birth to the shepherds
- *The gifts of the Magi.

Heaven and Nature Sing combines worshipful narration, Bible readings, drama sketches, and (lots of) singing to create a fresh and joyful examination of the birth of our Savior. Heaven and Nature Sing Christmas Program can be used in conjunction with the 4-week elementary curriculum, or it can be used as a stand-alone production. The Christmas Program contains the same sketch content as the curriculum, but all other content is original.

This program runs approximately an hour in length, as follows:

SKETCH ONE - 4 minutes

WORSHIP ONE - 7 minutes

SKETCH TWO - 4 minutes

WORSHIP TWO - 9 minutes

SKETCH THREE – 4 minutes

WORSHIP FOUR - 11 minutes

WORSHIP PROGRAM:

Speakers Bible Readers

The number of Speakers and Bible Readers needed for the worship portion of the program is adjustable, depending on the number of people you have available. It can be done with as little as 2 (1 Speaker, 1 Bible Reader) or as many as 14 (9 Speakers and 5 Bible Readers).

All scriptures used are from the New International Version (NIV) of the Bible.

SPEAKER 1:

Our God is great and worthy to be praised. We join with all of creation in praising and celebrating the giver of life. From the mightiest ruler to the lowest peasant, from the cattle in the stall to the heavenly beings, we join them in honoring our Maker. Tonight we celebrate the Advent Season – that unique time each year where we take the opportunity to praise God for sending Jesus to earth as a baby. There was much celebrating that fi rst Christmas.

-The Magi honored God with their gifts.

-The shepherds were so changed by their visit, they told everyone they saw about the encounter with Jesus.

INTRODUCTION



SPEAKER 1{CONT.}:

-Even before his birth, Mary's relative, Elizabeth, praised Jesus. And so did John, the baby still growing inside Elizabeth.

-And of course the angels in heaven rejoiced. The angels were very busy during this time, heralding Jesus' birth. It was an angel who told Elizabeth that she would finally have a son in her old age. It was an angel who told Mary that she would have God's son, even though she was still a virgin. An angel told Joseph that he should not be afraid to take Mary as his wife. And it was angels who were there to tell the shepherds that Jesus had been born in Bethlehem.

A herald is a messenger, someone delivering news. There were many herald angels delivering good news that first Christmas. Speaking of Harold... (Speaker 1 exits quickly as Phanuel enters)

HAROLD THE ANGEL SINGS: PART ONE



Phanuel enters carrying a clipboard. He looks out at the audience.

PHANUEL: What a beautiful day to be up in heaven. Just like yesterday. And the day before. Well, they're all beautiful, now that I think about it.

Harold enters and rushes up to Phanuel.

HAROLD: Harold the Angel reporting for duty, sir.

PHANUEL: Ah, you must be the new transfer from Cloud 9.

HAROLD: Yes, sir.

PHANUEL: Oh, you don't have to be so formal. Just call me Phanuel. And what did you say your name was again?

HAROLD: Harold, sir. I mean, Mr. Phanuel.

PHANUEL: Just Phanuel. Harold? That's kind of an unusual name for an angel, isn't it?

HAROLD: I wouldn't know. I'm glad to be here, sir. I'm ready to go to work. Do you have an assignment for me?

Phanuel consults his clipboard.

PHANUEL: Well, let's see now. Do you have any special skills?

HAROLD: I can sing.

PHANUEL: We could use a few new guardian angels to help protect the humans. They always seem to be getting themselves into trouble.

HAROLD: I'm a singer.

PHANUEL: Well, I don't really need a singer right now. We're always looking for good messengers.

HAROLD: What do they do?

PHANUEL: They go to earth and talk to humans, delivering the message that God has given them. In fact, we've got a special message that needs to be delivered soon to a young girl in Nazareth named Mary. God wants her to know that she has found favor with him. She is going to give birth to the son of God.

HAROLD: Jesus?

PHANUEL: Yes.

PHANUEL: I know. Jesus' arrival on earth is going to be the cause of a lot of rejoicing and celebration here in heaven and down there on earth.

HAROLD: That's a big message.

PHANUEL: Does it sound like something you could handle?

HAROLD: It depends.

PHANUEL: On what?

HAROLD: Can I sing the message?

PHANUEL: You're really into singing, aren't you? Okay Harold, let's hear what you've got.

Harold takes a few moments to warm up.

HAROLD: Me, me, me, me. (screaming, ugly) JOY TO THE WORLD, THE LORD IS COME,

LET EAR-

PHANUEL: Thank you, Harold. That's enough now. I've heard all I need to hear.

HAROLD: What do you think? Ain't I a natural born singer?

PHANUEL: You. . . You are. . . something else, Harold. I've never heard anything like you.

HAROLD: So, what time do you need me to go down to earth and sing for this lady who's going to give birth to Jesus?

PHANUEL: You know what? I think I'll send Gabriel. He was down there a few months ago talking to a guy named Zechariah about the baby he and his wife Elizabeth are going to have. He knows the lay of the land pretty well already.

HAROLD: Okay, that's fine. So what assignment do you have for me?

SPEAKER 2:

Jesus' arrival on the scene is the cause for great celebration for all of humanity. For all of creation. But the official birth announcement did not come with a lot of fanfare. There were no proclamations in the town square. There were no parades in the street declaring that the Messiah would soon be born.

It was just a single visitor and a frightened young girl. That visitor happened to be a messenger from heaven. And the message he delivered not only changed her life, but it changed the course of history.

BIBLE READER 2:

In the sixth month of Elizabeth's pregnancy, God sent the angel Gabriel to Nazareth, a town in Galilee, to a virgin pledged to be married to a man named Joseph, a descendant of David. The virgin's name was Mary. The angel went to her and said, "Greetings, you who are highly favored! The Lord is with you."

Mary was greatly troubled at his words and wondered what kind of greeting this might be. But the angel said to her, "Do not be afraid, Mary; you have found favor with God. You will conceive and give birth to a son, and you are to call him Jesus. He will be great and will be called the Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him the throne of his father David, and he will reign over Jacob's descendants forever; his kingdom will never end."

"How will this be," Mary asked the angel, "since I am a virgin?"

The angel answered, "The Holy Spirit will come on you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you. So the holy one to be born will be called the Son of God. Even Elizabeth your relative is going to have a child in her old age, and she who was said to be unable to conceive is in her sixth month. For no word from God will ever fail."

"I am the Lord's servant," Mary answered. "May your word to me be fulfilled." Then the angel left her.

SPEAKER 3:

When we bring our concerns to Jesus, his perfect love will drive away the fear and doubt, freeing us to praise God and to celebrate Jesus with all of our hearts.

Serafina and Daniel are sitting at the table eating snacks. They don't look too happy. Harold enters, all smiles. He sits down at their table.

HAROLD: Hey guys, isn't it a beautiful day?

SERAFINA: Yes, it is.

DANIEL: We're in heaven. It's always a beautiful day.

SERAFINA: Would you like a snack?

HAROLD: Oh no, I'm too excited to eat.

DANIEL: Really? What's up, Harold? I could use some excitement.

DANIEL: That's okay, Harold. We believe you. You don't have to prove it by singing.

DANIEL: (to Serafina) Oh, I can't wait for Jesus to arrive. I wonder where he's going to be born?

Daniel and Serafina rise and walk away from the table.

SERAFINA: A palace, I bet. That's where a king should be born.

DANIEL: Yeah, but Joseph and Mary are poor people. Jesus is more likely to be born in a cow stable than a palace.

SERAFINA: Sure, Jesus is going to be born in a stable. That's rich.

They exit.

HAROLD: Shucks. I thought I had enlisted two more people to sing with me. Oh well, I guess I'm still on my own. (*Screaming*) JOY TO THE WORLD, THE LORD IS COME, LET EARTH RECEIVE HER KING.

WORSHIP: PART TWO





Jesus is the one and only true Savior of the world. However, he wasn't the only miracle baby being born during this time. Earlier, Zechariah – a priest who served in the temple – was visited by an angel and told that he and his wife Elizabeth would have a son. Elizabeth had never been able to conceive before, and now she and Zechariah were too old to have children. But God gave them a miracle, a child named John.

After Mary's visit from the angel, she took a trip to visit Elizabeth, who was a relative of hers. They were both with child, and when they got together, a little celebration broke out.

BIBLE READER 3:

At that time Mary got ready and hurried to a town in the hill country of Judea, where she entered Zechariah's home and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the baby leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth was filled with the Holy Spirit. In a loud voice she exclaimed: "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the child you will bear! But why am I so favored, that the mother of my Lord should come to me? As soon as the sound of your greeting reached my ears, the baby in my womb leaped for joy. Blessed is she who has believed that the Lord would fulfill his promises to her!"

And Mary said:

We can all celebrate Jesus. You don't have to be rich and powerful. You don't have to have be perfect. As this story tells us, you don't even have to be born yet.



Jordan rushes out.

SING: The First Noel

SPEAKER 6:

Jesus has arrived! The Father has demonstrated his great love by sending us his son. It's a cause for great celebration.

Jesus was born in Bethlehem – a small town, not much to speak of. The government was conducting a census and so the town was crowded with people. Mary was forced to deliver her baby in a stable.

The Savior of the world was born in a barn. The Son of God took his first nap in a feeding trough. But even these humble surroundings couldn't stop the celebration.

BIBLE READER 4:

So Joseph also went up from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to Bethlehem the town of David, because he belonged to the house and line of David. He went there to register with Mary, who was pledged to be married to him and was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for the baby to be born, and she gave birth to her firstborn, a son. She wrapped him in cloths and placed him in a manger, because there was no guest room available for them.

And there were shepherds living out in the fields nearby, keeping watch over their flocks at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news that will cause great joy for all the people. Today in the town of David a Savior has been born to you; he is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign to you: You will find a baby wrapped in cloths and lying in a manger."

Suddenly a great company of the heavenly host appeared with the angel, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven,

and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests."

SPEAKER 7:

The angels celebrated by declaring the birth of Jesus to the shepherds out in the fields. The shepherds went to Bethlehem and saw the baby for themselves. They praised God, and kept the celebration going by telling everyone they encountered about what they had seen. We don't how many more visitors came to the stable that night because of the shepherds' testimony, but the Bible does tell us that everyone who heard was amazed.

When we praise Jesus with our whole hearts, we can't help but keep the celebration going by sharing him with others. For the Jesus we know isn't just lying in that manger.

SPEAKER 7 (CONT.):

We know that Jesus walked through the countryside. We've know he preached on the mountain. We know that he walked on water. We know that he multiplied the loaves and fish. We know he was crucified, bearing the shame of our sin. And most importantly, we know he defeated death and rose again.

Jesus gave his life for us, robbing sin of its power. He rose again, ending the curse of death. We have much to celebrate. We have much to share with others.

HAROLD THE ANGEL SINGS: PART FOUR

Harold sits at the table munching on snacks. This is the first time we've ever seen him unhappy. Serafina and Daniel enter and join Harold at the table. They look concerned.

SERAFINA: Good morning, Harold.

HAROLD: Morning.

DANIEL: Isn't it a beautiful day?

HAROLD: Yep.

SERAFINA: It's good to see you. I haven't seen you around much lately.

Harold just keeps eating.

DANIEL: We were thinking it might be fun to do something together later. Would you like to come

along?

HAROLD: What are you doing?

DANIEL: I thought we could play some Angel Charades.

SERAFINA: What are Angel Charades?

DANIEL: It's like regular charades but it's played by angels.

Harold just keeps eating.

DANIEL: If you don't want to do that, we could play Angel Apples to Apples or Angel Scatergories.

HAROLD: I don't really feel much like doing anything.

SERAFINA: What's wrong, Harold? We're your friends, you can tell us.

HAROLD: I've come to realize that I am a terrible singer.

SERAFINA: You're what?

HAROLD: I love to sing and I always thought I was great at it. And now I see that every time I open my mouth and sing (screams) "JOY TO THE WORLD" that it hurts people's ears. And angels' too.

DANIEL: Harold, you're being silly.

HAROLD: So do you think I sing well?

DANIEL: Well, no.

Harold lets out a moan of sorrow.

SERAFINA: Daniel!

DANIEL: Well, he asked. I'm not going to lie to him. I'm an angel.

HAROLD: It's okay. I want you to be truthful. I just don't know what to do now that I realize I can't sing. All I've ever wanted was to be a singer. To give praise to God. Now that I don't have that, I don't have anything to honor God with.

SERAFINA: Now that's just absolute nonsense. You have so much to offer God.

HAROLD: You're just saying that.

SERAFINA: No, I'm not. You have your enthusiasm. Angels like being around you, Harold, because you always see the good in people and in situations. You encourage everyone that you come in contact with.

HAROLD: So.

SERAFINA: So that's a rare talent. Not everyone can do that.

DANIEL: And you're a hard worker.

HAROLD: Am I?

DANIEL: Sure, I've seen your assignment sheets. You always have about twice as many things to do as the rest of us. They give you so much because you work so hard. And you never complain about what you have to do.

SERAFINA: And you're funny. Why, you're always making the rest of us laugh.

HAROLD: I'm funny?

DANIEL: Sure. Remember that knock knock joke you told in the break room last week? You had water shooting out of Gabriel's nose.

HAROLD: Thanks, you two. I guess I do have talents and abilities to honor God with.

HAROLD: (Singing terribly) JOY TO THE WORLD, THE LORD IS COME,

Serafina and Daniel each put an arm around Harold's shoulders and start singing along. They sound just as bad as Harold.

The good news of Jesus is for all people. The people of Israel were waiting for a Messiah who would restore their nation, but God sent a Savior who would restore each of us, reconciling us to God.

Even the first Christmas had a diverse group of people celebrating. The lowly shepherds had come from nearby to see the baby. Later, a group of Magi – stargazers from a distant land east of Israel- also came to see the baby.

BIBLE READER 5:

After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem and asked, "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him."

When King Herod heard this he was disturbed, and all Jerusalem with him. When he had called together all the people's chief priests and teachers of the law, he asked them where the Messiah was to be born. "In Bethlehem in Judea," they replied, "for this is what the prophet has written:

"But you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah,

are by no means least among the rulers of Judah;

for out of you will come a ruler

who will shepherd my people Israel."

After they had heard the king, they went on their way, and the star they had seen when it rose went ahead of them until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw the star, they were overjoyed. On coming to the house, they saw the child with his mother Mary, and they bowed down and worshiped him. Then they opened their treasures and presented him with gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to go back to Herod, they returned to their country by another route.
