Notes from the Treasurer | Mid-December Update

Regrettably, donations continue to fall short of the weekly targets. For weeks 1 & 2 of this December, the goal was \$4,000 per Sunday. We stand at about \$6,000, a shortfall of \$2,000. As a guide, this time last year we had donations of \$11,650. The monthly goal in 2024 was the same as this year, \$60,000. However, we achieved \$74,650! In 2024! The challenge is before us for this year!

On a special note, I'm very pleased to report that a donation of \$20,000 by Sharon Bate, in memory of her late husband John Bate, has been received. John had a life-long long association with the Anglican church.
