Lighting the Christmas Candle

Celebrant: For the last four Sundays we have been lighting candles at the beginning of every Service. The first candle reminds us of HOPE.

The first candle is lit

All: THERE IS NO REAL HOPE WITHOUT JESUS.

The second candle is lit

The second candle reminds us of PEACE.

All: THERE IS NO REAL PEACE WITHOUT JESUS.

The third candle is lit

The third candle reminds us of JOY.

All: THERE IS NO REAL JOY WITHOUT JESUS.

The fourth and final Advent candle is lit.

This fourth candle reminds us of LOVE - God's love for the whole world.

All: THERE IS NO REAL LOVE WITHOUT JESUS.

We wait no longer. Now is the moment to celebrate the birth of the baby Jesus, and place him in the manger's bed.

The white Christmas candle is now lit

We pray together, saying:

God of love, you sent your Son, Jesus, to shine bright like the sun, lighting the way for all who walk in darkness. May the light of Christ's hope, peace, joy and love shine bright in us as we approach his coming, that we may be ready to welcome him this Christmas, and every day which follows. Amen.

The Readings (Diane Elliott)

The First Reading

Reader: A Reading from the Prophet Isaiah. (Ch. 9:2-7)

The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness — on them light has shined. You have multiplied the nation, you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the

harvest, as people exult when dividing plunder. For the yoke of their burden, and the bar across their shoulders, the rod of their oppressor, you have broken as on the day of Midian. For all the boots of the tramping warriors and all the garments rolled in blood shall be burned as fuel for the fire. For a child has been born for us, a son given to us; authority rests upon his shoulders; and he is named Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. His authority shall grow continually, and there shall be endless peace for the throne of David and his kingdom. He will establish and uphold it with justice and with righteousness from this time onward and forevermore. The zeal of the Lord of hosts will do this.

Reader: The word of the Lord **All:** Thanks be to God.

The Psalm

Psalm 96 (vv 1-2, 9-12)

REFRAIN: All the ends of the earth shall see the salvation of our God.

Sing to the Lord a new song; sing to the Lord, all the whole earth. Sing to the Lord and bless his name; proclaim the good news of his salvation from day to day. **R.**

Worship the Lord in the beauty of holiness; let the whole earth tremble before him. **R**.

For the grace of God has appeared, bringing salvation to all, training us to renounce impiety and worldly passions, and in the present age to live lives that are self-controlled, upright, and godly, while we wait for the blessed hope and the manifestation of the glory of our great God and Saviour Jesus Christ. He it is who gave himself for us that he might redeem us from all iniquity and purify for himself a people of his own who are zealous for good deeds.

Reader: The word of the Lord. **All:** Thanks be to God.

The Gradual Hymn

The Gospel Reading

Celebrant: The Lord be with you.

All: And also with you.

Celebrant: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ

according to Luke (Ch:2:1-20)

All: Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went

to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn. In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see -Iam bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest heaven, and on earth peace among those whom he favors!"

When the angels had left them and gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem and see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." So they went with haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the child lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. But Mary treasured all these words and pondered them in her heart. The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.

Celebrant: Almighty God, have mercy upon you, pardon and deliver you from all your sins, confirm and strengthen you in all goodness, and keep you in eternal life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Celebrant: The Lord be with you **And also with you.**

Celebrant: Lift up your hearts.

All: We lift them to the Lord.

Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: It is right to give our thanks and

praise.

Celebrant: We give you thanks and praise, almighty

God, through your beloved Son, Jesus

Christ, our Saviour and Redeemer. He is your living Word,

through whom you have created all things.

By the power of the Holy Spirit He took flesh of the Virgin Mary and shared our human nature. He lived and died as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.

In fulfilment of your will, He stretched out his hands in suffering, to bring release to those who place their hope in you; and so He won for you a holy people.

Blessed are you, gracious God, creator of heaven and earth; we give you thanks and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord, who in the mystery of his incarnation was made perfect man of the flesh of the virgin Mary his mother; in him we have seen a new and radiant vision of your glory. Therefore with all the angels of heaven we lift our voices and sing our joyful hymn of praise to proclaim the glory of your name.

All: Holy, holy, Lord God almighty

Worthy is the Lamb who was slain. Highest praises, honour, and glory.

Celebrant: Holy and gracious God, accept our praise,

through your Son our Saviour Jesus Christ;

who on the night He was handed over to suffering and death, took bread and gave you thanks, saying, "Take, and eat: this is my body which is broken for you." In the same way He took the cup, saying, "This is my blood which was shed for you. When you do this, you do it in memory of me." Remembering, therefore, his death and resurrection, we offer you this bread and this cup, giving thanks that you have made us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you. We ask you to send your Holy Spirit upon the offering of your holy Church. Gather into one all who share in these sacred mysteries, filling them with the Holy Spirit and confirming their faith in the truth, that together we may praise you and give you glory through your servant Jesus Christ.

All glory and honour are yours, Father and Son, with the Holy Spirit in the holy Church, now and for ever. **Amen.**
