The 24-25 Sunday School year was completed in May with the K-1st grade through middle school classes showcasing their memorization pieces during two different church services. Soon after school ended for the year, we co-hosted "Road Trip" Community Vacation Bible School with the Christian Reformed Church.

In the summer, we had 18 middle schoolers and chaperones attend Power Connection in Minnesota. We also had one middle schooler attend a summer Bible camp, who received reimbursement funds through the Education Team budget. We pray they all had a meaningful and faithbuilding time at these two events.

Our Sunday School kick-off for the 25-26 Sunday School year included a dunk tank where church members of all ages dunked Pastor Gary, Michelle Vande Weerd and Nicole Vande Weerd. Members also made bracelets, using UV-activated beads. Members were encouraged to make enough to share with community members. Supplies for the beads were purchased in conjunction with MESA.

We finished 2025 with a Christmas program on December 19th. This was held during the traditional Sunday morning service and Sunday School members were active in multiple portions of the service including prelude, Advent candle lighting, leading of the worship songs and sharing Christmas-themes readings.

We appreciate all the help and support given to the Education Team, especially our Sunday School teachers, music leaders and youth group volunteers.

MESA (Mission, Evangelism and Social Action) submitted by Tim Goetsch, Chair As we close out 2025, I am grateful for the faithful service and generosity of the MESA Team and the entire congregation. Through our collective efforts, we have supported local ministries, international missions, and community outreach in meaningful ways, all while fostering fellowship and spiritual growth. Below is a summary of our key activities and accomplishments this year.

#### **Support for Local Ministries and Community Needs**

- The Harvest Table Soup Kitchen—collected \$520 through our February "Souper Bowl" offering to purchase food for meals. Served meals twice during the year (spring and fall), each time feeding approximately 80 people. Donated remaining funds of \$210.25 directly to The Harvest Table.
- Option One Pregnancy Center—collected and delivered needed items in the spring. Organized a successful pie sale at Old Timer's Day, raising \$1,218, which was donated to Option One.
- Center of Hope—conducted two collection drives (spring and fall) for essential items and clothing, with deliveries made shortly after each drive.
- The Family Back to School Project—submitted Hy-Vee receipts throughout the year, receiving a \$1,000 check that was donated to support back-to-school needs.
- Volga Christian School—collected and delivered school supplies to help students prepare for the new school year.
- Freedom's Gate Church—served a meal to more than 70 people and joined them for a Sunday service, strengthening our partnership.
- Teen Challenge of the Dakotas—held a bake sale at the Beta Psi Gallery of Gifts craft show in December, raising nearly \$800, which was donated to support their mission.

#### **Global and Mission Support**

- Casa Del Maestro (Cusco, Peru– Sandy and Albino Rodriguez) hosted the Rodriguez family during their US visit. They shared an update on their mission work with the congregation. MESA provided a meal (served by the Congregational Care Team) and contributed \$150 toward their travel expenses.
- Words of Hope—hosted a speaker who shared about their ministry, accompanied by a special offering to support their work.
- Operation Christmas Child—collected more than 40 filled boxes, which were delivered for distribution to children around the world.
