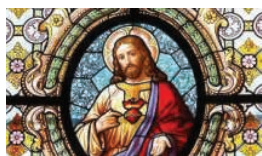

SPN Parish Council Holy Moment Thought... "Grace"

Do you realize that God always chooses to give us the graces we need, but we do not always choose to accept these graces? Yes, God is always more willing to give us more grace than we are ready to receive.

Grace is a gift, and every gift is doubly free...freely given and freely received. For example, if we are both standing in the path of a vehicle, and I slip and fall and knock you over like a domino, and that accident saves both our lives, that is a gift that is neither freely given nor freely received. When I offer you advice, but you do not trust me or believe me or act on my advice, that is a gift that is freely given but not freely received. When I give you a present and you thank me for it that is a gift that is both freely given and freely received. When God gives us His grace that is a gift that is freely given by God, and sometimes it is also freely received by us, but sometimes it is not. If we don't believe in God's grace, if we don't trust Him, then we don't receive it, we don't get the gift.

That's true both of the many moment-by-moment graces, which theologians call "actual graces", meaning that God offers us every day, and it's also true of the most basic grace, the gift of salvation, the gift of the forgiveness of our sins, the gift of eternal life in Christ, which theologians call "sanctifying grace".

Therefore, if we have made the big choice to say yes to God's gift of salvation, we should also make the little choices to say yes to God and be encouraged and strengthened day by day. Our big choice to accept and trust God's "sanctifying grace" which is our eternal salvation, ought to be the model for our little choices to say yes to God's "actual graces" that He offers us in every situation in our lives.

These actual graces give us the courage to say "thy will be done" and to act on that, to do the right thing no matter what the costs! ("Food for the Soul" by Peter Kreeft) **Let us reflect on these thoughts as we approach this Advent Season. God bless you all!**

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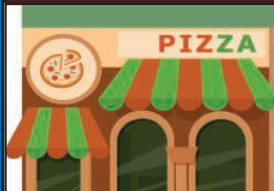
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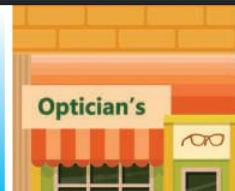
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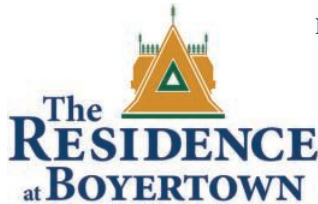
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
