
A Mature Spirit-Led Faith


Maturity produces stability and discernment

- Hebrews says mature people have their "powers of discernment trained by constant practice to distinguish good from evil" (Hebrews 5:14).




Maturity looks like:

- you don't get manipulated by every fear.




Maturity shows up as love that builds others up
