


## **Introduction**


## CHILDREN'S MESSAGE PRAYER OF ILLUMINATION FIRST READING

Reflection questions:

- 1. Isaiah speaks of God sharing in the people's suffering: "In all their distress, he too was distressed." What difference does it make to believe in a God who suffers with us?
- 2. How do you respond to hearing a story of such deep tragedy in the Christmas season? What emotions does it stir?
- 3. What does Christmas mean when it meets the harder truths of life—and how does Christ still become "God with us"?





#### THE DISTRIBUTION OF HOLY COMMUNION


Welcome to the Lord's Table!


