

All: It is right to give our thanks and praise.



## Readings for January 4 – The Epiphany of the Lord

**Isaiah 60:1-6** The glory of the Lord is light for all the nations.

**Psalm 72:1-7, 10-14** In the ancient Near East, kings were next to gods. A king and his heir were seen as endowed with justice by gods, and had special responsibility for the poor and needy. This psalm is a prayer for the king, possibly written for a coronation.

**Ephesians 3:1-12** The manifestation of God's revelation to the Gentiles is celebrated and Paul's ministry to them affirmed.

Matthew 2:1-12 "Wise men" (in Latin: magi) were members of a Persian caste of astrologers and interpreters of dreams. Astrology was widely accepted then. A star was associated with each person; the way the star rose told the wise men that a king had been born. A later church tradition called the wise men kings.
