As we barrel into the new year, it's occurred to me that I've been thinking about history quite often the past few months. I've had several conversations with different members concerning the background of this congregation, and also the different families I meet in town and how they connect. I've also been doing a little bit of family genealogy research, trying to answer some personal questions and connect some dots.

A lot of the information on both accounts is interesting, generating more curiosity. Some of the information is delicate, better left alone right where I found it. Like the remnants of an explosion from decades ago, with enough sensitive material laying around that if it's disturbed the only outcome would be more damage.

The thing that keeps coming to mind when I encounter some of the wreckage of the past is that because of Christ, this is not my identity, it's not your identity. Long ago Jesus clothed us in His righteousness in our baptism. That garment is appropriate for all occasions.

Whether it's a celebrated moment in life befitting of a black tie celebration, or when we get near a place that's still smoldering from an explosion of grief, anger, or betrayal. Some of us may feel like we're sitting in the midst of an active house fire where everything around us is burning and we're just trying to find the survivors. That garment covers us there too.

The Apostle Paul tells us in Romans 8 that because we are in Christ Jesus, there is no more condemnation. He goes on to say that because Christ has given us His Spirit we await in hope. He also tells us, "If God be for us, who can be against us?"

He closes the chapter telling us, "Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword?" The Apostle says, "No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us."

Christ has put His garment on us, and He meets us in the cross. In all of these things He is with you! Our history does not define us, Christ does, because our history is His-story.

In baptism Christ has claimed us, and one day these temporal things will pass away and Jesus will make all things new!




Annual Congregational Meeting



Call to Order/Devotions/Approve last month's meeting minutes:

Mark made a motion to approve last month's meeting minutes with the revision and was seconded by Lindsay. MCU.

Constitution Review Committee Recommendation. Michelle and Cindy were present at the meeting and provided everyone with a copy of their recommendation – see attached.

A motion was made by Kevin and was seconded by Linday to accept the recommendations noted in red on their recommendation. MCU.

A motion was made by Mark and was seconded by Kevin to approve a temporary constitutional addendum allowing a current Church Council member who has completed a three-year term to serve an additional fourth year in 2026 and a fifth year in 2027. This extension is intended to support continuity and a smooth transition between the Church Council following the pastoral hiring process, and to realign the rotation of Church Council members moving forward. Cortni abstained. MC.

A motion was made by Kenton and was seconded by Rick to create a ballot to be used at our Annual Meeting in January as per the NALC guidelines regarding Amendment One – voting yes, Amendment Two – voting no, and Amendment Three – voting yes. MCU.

The Annual Meeting is scheduled for the third Sunday in January which is Sunday, January 18, 2026, following our Worship Service.

Council will provide desserts and drinks. Cortni will bring the lemonade and everyone else a dessert.

We will take down the Christmas decoration following Epiphany Sunday on Sunday, January 4th, 2026.

A motion was made by Kenton and was seconded by Kevin to approve the proposed 2026 Budget with the following adjustments:

Line Item 5500 Continuing Education, increase to \$6,000.00, which increased the total proposed budget to \$519,954.00.
