After weeks of uncertainty surrounding ingredient costs—driven by tariff fluctuations and persistently high chicken prices—costs finally dipped just in time for stew week. Still, the team faced a few logistical hurdles.

With over 800 quarts pre-sold, we discovered on Wednesday that one of the essential stew pots was unavailable—just days before the Saturday event. A frantic phone call to Rev. Bill James, connected us with Skipwith United Methodist Church and, ultimately, Saint Andrew's UMC in Henrico's West End. After several conversations with their chair of trustees, two pots were secured, and we were back on track!

We extend heartfelt thanks to everyone who made this annual fundraiser a success. Whether you helped pick up pots on Thursday, chopped vegetables on Friday, stirred, packaged, cleaned up on Saturday, returned pots to Shady Grove and Saint Andrew's on Sunday, or purchased stew—your support made it all possible.

We made well over 900 quarts with the profits going to enable the United Methodist Men to assist with projects and needs around the church and throughout the Lakeside community.
