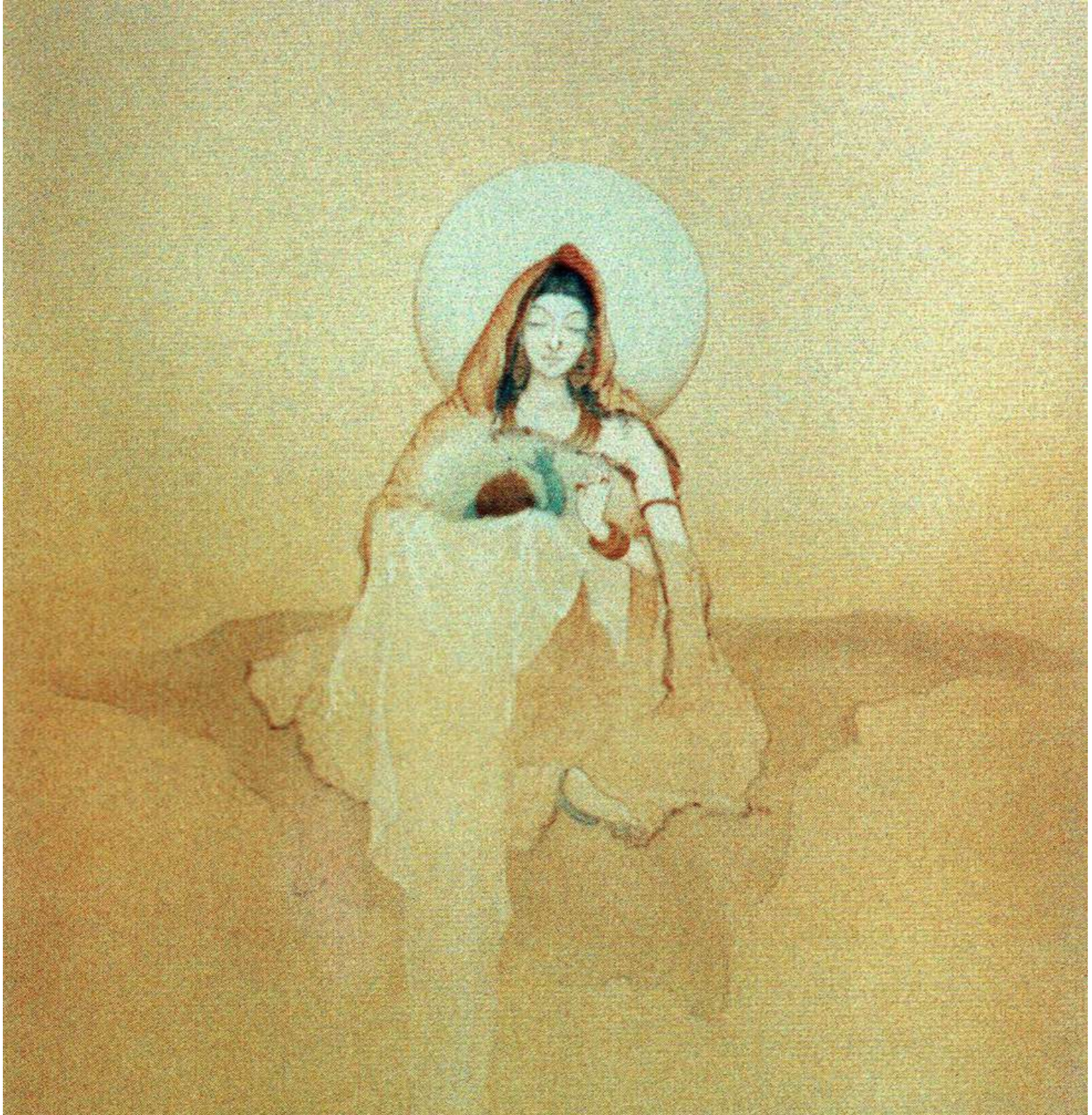

Liturgist: The dream is for the world to be as it is in heaven. A place where every person is valued, just as they are, and our systems reflect the best of caring for one another.

AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

One: Let us affirm God's gift of revelation and the courageous faith it asks of us.

All: We believe God's revelation comes to us in the quiet and the subtle, from the margins and in the cries of nature. God's revelation comes through dreams, the light of stars, and the voices of those fearing for their lives. We believe the message of God's revelation is always an urgent one, calling for immediate trust and radical care. It continually points toward justice, asking us to defy and resist the harmful forces around us. We believe, like Joseph, who protected his family, God's revelation shines on the path of protection, asking us to be sheltering arms for the vulnerable. We believe, like the magi, who listened to the voice of the Spirit rather than that of empire, God's revelation calls us to courageous faith and embodied resistance. We believe, like a single star shining in the sky, God's revelation empowers us to a purity of heart and calling, where we have clarity on what we are to do, and live it out with simple, steady faithfulness. So, we commit ourselves to small acts of courage as holy epiphanies, trusting that with each one, God's revelation will spread and shine.

STAR WORDS INTRODUCTION

Today is Epiphany, a day in the liturgical calendar when we celebrate the magi's arrival to Jesus. The magi, a noble group of people, studied stars and knew when a new one appeared. The star guided them to the place of Jesus' birth, where they recognized and honored Jesus as king. After the service, you will have the opportunity to choose a star word. You can spend time reading through the words and choosing one for your year, or select one at random. Your word might instantly make sense to you or be a bit of a mystery. We encourage you to keep it in a place where you will see it daily (such as a bathroom mirror, bedside table, or car).

All: Holy One, as the star once guided the magi, so may these words guide our hearts and steps. Let each word shine with your light, becoming intention and prayer for the year ahead. Amen.
