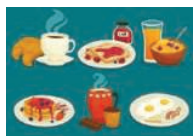

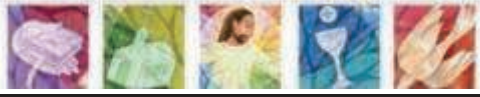

LECTIO DIVINA – Meets on Thursday mornings at 10:30AM in the St. Anne's Meeting Room. If you have not been part of Lectio in the past, Lectio Divina means "divine reading" in Latin. It is a traditional Christian practice of scriptural reading and prayer intended to promote communion with God. It involves a slow, contemplative reading of a passage of Scripture, with the goal of encountering God through His Word. We read, reflect and discuss the readings and the Gospel for the coming Sunday. All are welcome!

Pasta and Sauce

The Open Link's Community Food Pantry is designed to provide food to local families (our neighbors) who do not currently have the financial means to meet their nutritional needs.

Several Local Churches routinely collect and donate the same category of food. For example, one church is known as the "cereal church" and another is known as the "chili church".

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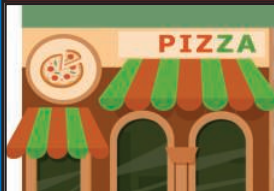
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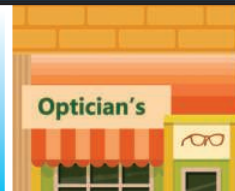
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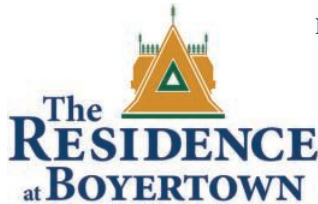
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
