with Rev. Sara Smalley and Audrey McCann

Our guest speaker, Dr. Elías Ortega, President of Meadville Lombard Theological School and Professor of Religion, Ethics, and Leadership, will be in town to speak at UUFN on Sunday and at Carleton on Monday. A committed advocate for justice-making and civic engagement, Dr. Ortega has played key roles in Unitarian Universalist initiatives, including serving on the UUA's Commission on Institutional Change. Dr. Ortega's leadership at Meadville Lombard – a Unitarian Universalist seminary in Chicago – reflects his vision for theological education that integrates intellectual rigor with spiritual practices to prepare leaders for a complex, multicultural world. It is Dr. Ortega's belief that lifting the Universalist heritage can inspire us to do the necessary work to realize a better tomorrow.

Much has changed in the past few years for our congregation: moving to a new building in 2018, hiring a new minister in 2021, weathering a global pandemic, completing a major building addition, resisting rising authoritarianism, and creating a growing multigenerational community.

Given all this change, it's time to reflect on who we have become, consider how we articulate what our work to do in the world is now, and dream about a future we want to create. Our current mission statement says that UUFN is "an inclusive community that nurtures spiritual and intellectual growth, and fosters ethical and social responsibility." We need you to help inform what we think our mission is now, and where it should guide us in the coming years.

Therefore, all members and friends of UUFN are invited to a morning of reflection and sharing as we begin preparing our next mission statement. Through exercises, conversations, and learning, we'll consider the stories that got us to today, the values that shape our congregation, and what UUFN is and hopes to be in the world. The work we do at this retreat will inform the task force that will craft the wording of the updated mission.

Do join us – your experiences and imagination are what we need!



Here's the Plan!

Several members of the UUFN have indicated an interest in vegetable gardening. The Green Team agrees that locally grown vegetables lead to a healthier diet, a better understanding of the connectedness of nature, and to a greener planet. In consultation with the Gardening Team we have come up with a three tiered plan.


The Green Team will take responsibility for this plan as the Gardening Team has plenty of other work to do.

Tier One: The Green Team will help people learn how to garden with pots at their own home.. This spring we will hold a workshop to help members learn the basics.

Tier Two: A raised garden bed is planned for under the kitchen window at UUFN. This can be used by the RE program to help our children and interested adults learn about gardening. Mary Davidson has volunteered to monitor this garden bed taking care of watering, etc.

Tier Three: Larry Vorwerk has a large garden on his property outside Northfield. He is happy to allow UUFN members to garden with him, learn from his expertise, and take a portion of the harvest bounty.
