
## Food For Thought

answered, and I remembered how Lena answers the locked door at Peace. I showed the reference number and asked for Lindsay. I was in the wrong place – I should have gone to the food bank. And I should phone first. I phoned while I slid back to my car. When I arrived, I wasn't surprised to see a very long line up – of both parked cars and humanity. I had done this before. BEFORE, I had had to wait in line in the cold, but today, I had a reference number and permission to walk straight to the front of the line, but I had to park a long way away. I almost fell several times, until the door volunteer handed over a large and very heavy, brightly wrapped package. This made it even harder to navigate my way back to the car. People were still lined up. They had bundle buggies and shopping bags and numerous family members to help carry things.

This is how some people get their food in Pickering. Some had volunteers such as me who had cars parked at the roadside, ready to deliver to apartments and houses. Some people did not have houses – you could tell. This is what church workers and community volunteers in Durham do – along with the underprivileged, they line up in the cold and ice for food. Or they collect, sort, package, and serve the food. Later in the day, the workers and volunteers return to shelter, stocked cupboards, a selection of clothing, hot water, and beds where they can have a good sleep to do it the next day.

Over the years, I have not slept so well in the winter, I used to lie awake imagining life at the end of the day for the others in line. Now I sleep a bit better, and if I can't I pray, and I reflect gratefully on the ministries at Peace along with other growing community services that make "the end of the day" a little more comfortable for the underprivileged in Durham. I sleep a little better in the winter now, and I cling to the words of Deborah MacCracken – so many years ago – when she said she didn't focus on the countless masses of people in need, but those she was serving under her own roof in Tanzania.

All of us – at Peace especially can be assured that we make a difference and fulfill the Gospel.

## Women of Prayer

I would like to describe the nature of the exciting prayer group that started in 2025 and has shape-shifted into a more organized format. Since women have been attracted to participate and Jens has already formed a group for men, we decided to call ourselves “Women of Prayer”. Prayers centre around the church in the world and the family at home. We meet on the first and third Sundays of the month, after the service – with refreshments in either the old Narthex or the Jim Hern room. The leadership of the meetings rotates. There is a guiding scriptural theme that lasts for two sessions with the same leader. The first Sunday of the month focuses on scripture and testimony where women discuss how God’s kingdom is revealed in their lives or through answered prayers. The third Sunday of the month focuses on scripture and petition where women discuss scripture and pray. The duration is 30-40 minutes. The format is also drop in – no commitment is required other than the leader and the person bringing refreshments. Fellowship is warm and sincere. Women are invited to drop in and check out, come once a month for renewal, or fully engage in the group. Loosely connected to the Intercessors prayer group, it is a nice opportunity for intercessors to meet and pray face to face – which we haven’t done in years!! I hope to see you there!



## Healing Service - January 25, 2026

Please join us for a Healing Service on Sunday, January 25th led by Elizabeth and Arnold. What does it mean? It is a special worship service focused on seeking God's wholeness for body, mind, and spirit, involving prayers, scripture readings, and often anointing with oil, acknowledging that healing comes through Christ's love and forgiveness, not necessarily a physical cure, but embracing restoration, reconciliation, and finding strength in suffering. It's a time to intentionally bring struggles, sickness, and brokenness to Jesus, relying on the Holy Spirit for comfort and peace, and understanding healing as a broader concept of restoration to God, not just curing disease. We acknowledge that God's healing extends beyond physical ailments to emotional, relational, and spiritual needs, bringing balance to the whole person.

The practice of holding specific prayers for healing and anointing with oil symbolizes the Holy Spirit's presence through baptismal promises and stems from the bible (James 5: 13-16). This section is called "the Prayer of Faith"<sup>13</sup> Is any one among you suffering? Let him pray. Is any cheerful? Let him sing praise. <sup>14</sup> Is any among you sick? Let him call for the elders of the church, and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord; <sup>15</sup> and the prayer of faith will save the sick man, and the Lord will raise him up; and if he has committed sins, he will be forgiven. <sup>16</sup> Therefore confess your sins to one another, and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous man has great power in its effects."

## Helga Laumer—Lovingly Remembered



Helga Laumer, a long-time member of Peace Lutheran Church passed away peacefully at 1:20 AM at Lakeridge Health, Ajax Pickering Hospital on December 31. Helga had attended Peace almost from its beginning, and her children, Dave and Diana were baptized and confirmed there – growing up with other Peace families who continue to attend Peace today. She was very involved in raising her grandson David, who helped her out during COVID and visited her. Don and Gloria Becker were friends of the Laumer family and have been phoning Helga for a long time since her health made it difficult to attend in person. One exception is that she tried to attend a service this fall and shared peace with her friends.

I remember Helga in the 90's at the Royal Bank where I banked – long before I attended Peace myself. I remember her walking to work over the 401 bridge on Liverpool Road. She loved to walk. When Ann Earley and I went for our marathon walks some years ago, we would sometimes pass by Helga's house and chat with her outside in her garden. Helga and I volunteered at Valley Farm Nursing home with Heddi's team, serving tea. She also enjoyed attending Advent dinners and congregational lunches at Peace.

Her son Dave lived with her when she became frail and cared for her tirelessly and lovingly. Very recently, her daughter Diana returned to Ontario from BC to help with the care. Our Peace Care team has enjoyed visiting Helga since last May – some highlights were Jemina singing hymns, Lena and I making her jam sandwiches, and Arnold and Shakura taking her communion. Members of the care team and Pastor Becker visited her in hospital, and it was nice to see Rosie singing and praying in German. Helga has been a memorable part of Peace history.

Please keep Dave and Diana in your thoughts and prayers. We will keep you informed as to Helga's funeral arrangements.

## DID YOU KNOW THIS?




Note: The seven gifts of the Holy Spirit--Prophesy, Serving, Teaching, Exhortation, Contribution, Leadership, and Mercy; and


The nine fruits of the Holy Spirit are--Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness, and Self Control.

The Twelve Days of Christmas mark the festive Christian season from Christmas Day (Dec. 25) and concludes January 5th, the Twelfth night, leading to the Epiphany (Jan. 6). These 12 days celebrates the Nativity of Jesus and the journey of the Magi to Bethlehem to honor him. It is also known as Christmastide or Twelfthtide.

We celebrate Jesus' birth and the arrival of the Three Wise Men (Magi), with each day holding religious significance and symbolic gifts from the popular cumulative song, representing core Christian beliefs like the Gospels, Commandments, Apostles, and Creed.




The people of Peace sincerely thank Matthew for the many ways he enriches our lives here at Peace!




