Message from the Rector's Desk

The Epiphany of the Lord

"When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary, his mother, and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh" (Matthew 2:10-11).

TELL – TEACH – TEND – TRANSFORM – TREASURE

Like the Magi, when they heard about the goodnews of Christ's birth, they had a mission to find out exactly what the mystery behind this news was. Thus, they were led to where Baby Jesus was born - "When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy" (Matthew 2:10). What this new year offers you depends on what you offer the new year. Our attitude should be all about perspective and intention to apply this either to our personal spiritual or corporate growth as a Church. Instead of waiting for the new year to bring opportunities, like the Magi, we're encouraged to be proactive and shape our own path. This mindset aligns with the theme of our personal growth and self-improvement as well, especially if we consider our Five Marks of Mission as Christians and Anglicans - ***TELL – TEACH – TEND – TRANSFORM – TREASURE***. The Anglican Five Marks of Mission are a beautiful framework for living out faith in action.

What are you offering the new year? It's about being intentional and generous. Just as the Magi brought valuable gifts, we too can offer our time, talents, and resources to shape our year as Chrsit's people. Let us think about what we want to achieve or experience in the new year and now consider what we are willing to offer or invest like the Magi:

- **Gold:** What valuable skills, time, or resources can you leverage in proclaiming the good news of our Lord Jesus Christ? (e.g., dedicating time to support people in need of help instead of criticizing them, helping to support people in the community to share the good news by our loving service, learning a new skills for spiritual growth and church development, etc.)
- **Frankincense:** How will you prioritize self-care, relationships, or spiritual growth? (e.g., meditation and self-reflection, quality time in prayer, reading the Word, spending quality time with our loved ones and those who need support, especially those we think that might be vulnerable among us)
- **Myrrh:** As a Church and faith community, what sacrifices or adjustments are needed for our growth? What habits or patterns are we willing to let go of or sacrifice for growth? Are we letting go and letting God? (e.g., limiting time on things that would not inspire us or others around us, unhealthy habits of not thinking positively of our ministries, pulling down instead of lifting ourselves up, especially in a time like this in our world where negativities have taken toll on our human endeavours, etc.)

As people of God, what the Magi did is meant for us to be holistic, outward-focused, and rooted in our faith journey this year. What's your take on this Magi mission to the star - Jesus? Are you willing to be part of a faith community and Jesus movement exploring new horizons for the Church?

Once again Happy New Year and may your journey this year like the Magi be a rewarding one. Amen.
