New Hope News

The song, "**The Twelve Days of Christmas**" is an English Christmas carol. From 1558 until 1829, Roman Catholics in England were not permitted to practice their faith openly. Someone during that era wrote this carol as a catechism song for young Catholics. It has two levels of meaning: the surface meaning plus a hidden meaning known only to members of the Church. Each element in the carol has a code word for a religious reality which the children could remember. To fit the number scheme, when you reach number 9, representing the Fruits of the Holy Ghost, the originator combined 6 to make 3, taking the 6 fruits that were similar: the fruit in each parenthesis was not named separately. There are actually Twelve Fruits of the Holy Ghost.

The "True Love" one hears in the song is not a smitten boy or girlfriend but Jesus Christ, because truly Love was born on Christmas Day.

On the first day of Christmas my true love gave to me . . . a partridge in a pear tree. The partridge in a pear tree represents Jesus, the Son of God, whose birthday we celebrate on the first day of Christmas. Christ is symbolically presented as a mother partridge, the only bird that will die to protect its young.

The two turtle doves were the Old and New Testaments

The three French hens stood for faith, hope, and love.

The four calling birds were the four gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John.

The five golden rings represented the first five books of the Old Testament, which describe man's fall into sin and the great love of God in sending a Savior.

The six geese a-laying stood for the six days of creation.

Seven swans a-swimming represented the sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit-----Prophecy, Serving, Teaching, Exhortation, Contribution, Leadership, and Mercy.

The eight maids a-milking were the eight beatitudes.

Nine ladies dancing were the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit-----Charity, Joy, Peace, Patience [Forbearance], Goodness [Kindness], Mildness, Fidelity, Modesty, Continency [Chastity].

The ten lords a-leaping were the Ten Commandments.

The eleven pipers piping stood for the eleven faithful Apostles.

The twelve drummers drumming symbolized the twelve points of belief in The Apostles' Creed.

New Year's Day, also called simply New Year's or New Year, is observed on January 1, the first day of the year on the modern Gregorian calendar as well as the Julian calendar. In pre-Christian Rome under the Julian calendar, the day was dedicated to Janus, god of gateways and beginnings, for whom January is also named. As a date in the Gregorian calendar of Christendom

EPIPHANY OF OUR LORD

Epiphany of our Lord, January 6. The term "epiphany" comes from a Greek word which means "appearance" or "manifestation". Epiphany was introduced into Western Christianity in the 4th century and is commonly linked in Western churches with the visit of the wise men (Magi) to the Christ child. Through the Magi, Jesus Christ revealed himself to the world as God's own Son. Epiphany is a Christian feast day that celebrates the revelation of God incarnate as Jesus Christ, observed on the sixth day of January. The twelve days between Christmas and Epiphany have often been called the "The Twelve Days of Christmas". Epiphany is sometimes called Three Kings' Day. Epiphany puts emphasis on the baptism of Jesus by John (Matthew 3:13-17; Mark 1:9-11; Luke 3:21-22) with Christ revealing himself to the world as God's own Son.

Today, Epiphany, open up to wisdom, let yourself be guided by the stars and the images of your dreams as you follow God's call to find Christ.

New Year Traditions

Many New Year traditions concern food. Here are a few:

Eat Something Special

1. In the southern United States, black-eyed peas and pork foretell good fortune
2. Eating any ring-shaped treat (such as a “donut) symbolizes coming full circle” and leads to good fortune. In Dutch homes, fritters called *olie bollen* are served
3. The Irish enjoy pastries called bannocks.
4. In India and Pakistan, rice promises prosperity.
5. Apples dipped in honey are a Rosh Hashanah tradition
6. In Swiss homes, dollops of whipped cream, symbolizing the richness of the year to come, are dropped on the floor (and allowed to remain there!)

Drink a Beverage

Although the pop of a champagne cork signals the arrival of the New Year around the world, some countries have their own traditions:

1. “Wassail,” the Gaelic term for “good health,” is served in some parts of England.
2. Spiced “hot pint” is the Scottish version of wassail. Traditionally, the Scots drank to each other and also offered this warm drink to neighbors along with a small gift.
3. In Holland, toasts are made with hot, spiced wine.

Give a Gift

1. New Year’s Day was once the time to swap presents.
2. Gifts of gilded nuts or coins marked the start of the new year in Rome
3. Eggs, the symbol of fertility, were exchanged by the Persians.
4. Early Egyptians traded earthenware flasks.
5. In Scotland, coal, shortbread, and silverware were traditionally exchanged for good luck.

THRIVENT

Thrivent Choice "Make a Personal Donation" Maybe you have heard it said many times "follow the prompts" to make a personal donation and have no clue what that actually means or how it works! So here's a little cheat sheet, I did some exploring to figure it out.

First of all, you don't have to be a Thrivent member to use this feature.

Second, it's a way to give via your credit card and rack up more points or miles and the organization (New Hope or someplace else) will get a record of your personal donation and should track that gift for you in the same way as if you had put a check in an envelope, it should be recorded by them for you

Third of all this is DIFFERENT than designating Thrivent Choice dollars for those of you who are Thrivent members

Fourth, it's not so easy as just having a link which is specific to New Hope, maybe we will do that in time, for now below is a cheat sheet to help you if you want to use the Thrivent choice personal donation system

1. go to thrivent.com
2. search box type in "thrivent choice"
3. once in thrivent choice click on "make a personal donation"
4. follow remaining prompts which are self explanatory

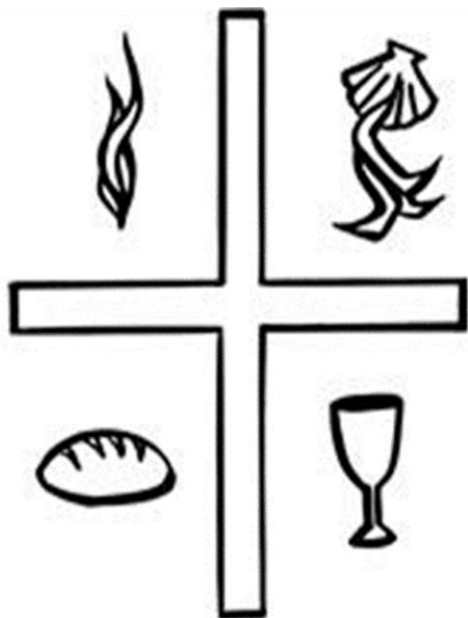

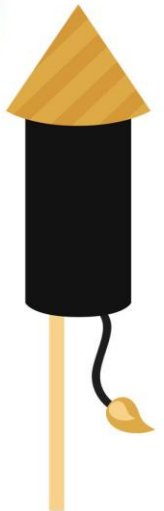
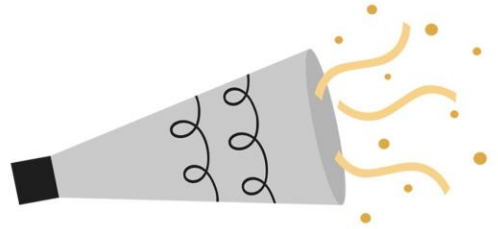


Katie's Food Pantry distributes food to our neighbors every Saturday, 9am – until food runs out.
