Once upon a time someone in the congregation recommended that we provide bottle water during church service and provided a donation for it. Well, as time has passed this bottle water kept in the fridge in Fowler for that purpose has expanded to a massive amount being used by attendees at all our church functions. One individual has been trying to keep the fridge stocked by paying out of pocket, making numerous trips to the store consistently, unloading water, and then stocking fridge. Water is now being consumed in massive amounts. It is not and cannot be provided through church funds; nor, do we want money donations given us for someone else to have to keep it stocked. We are asking for those that are using the bottle water to pickup a 12 pack or case occasionally when you do your shopping and bring it to Fowler Hall to help replenish the supply. The 8 ounce size is utilized the most or the 12 ounce. As of this writing, the only bottle water stocked in the fridge in Fowler will be what is brought in and donated. A volunteer will continue to provide water that will only be used for church service. Thank you for doing your part as a congregation.
