From the Mission Field:

Job & Adria Gámez

As many of you know, our family is currently living in the Midwest of the United States while I (Job) complete my citizenship process. While being here, we have noticed a significant need for Spanish-speaking evangelical churches among the Latino community.

Seeing that need, God opened the door for us to start a small group with five families who were interested in meeting together for worship and Bible study. For the first month, the group grew steadily, and we were encouraged to see families gathering every week in one of their homes.

However, during the second month, things began to change. A Pentecostal pastor moved into the area, and two families with Pentecostal backgrounds, we think, decided to join his gatherings. Shortly after, two other families stopped attending without notice, leaving us with just one family; the same one graciously hosting the meetings in their home.

Sadly, two weeks ago, that last family informed us that they would be moving away due to a new job opportunity. With their departure, our first attempt to plant a Spanish-speaking church in the area came to an end.

Although this has been discouraging, our hearts remain burdened for the spiritual needs of the Latino community here. We sincerely ask for your prayers, that God would give us wisdom to know how to serve Him during this season in the U.S., as we continue waiting to complete the citizenship process before returning to Honduras.
