

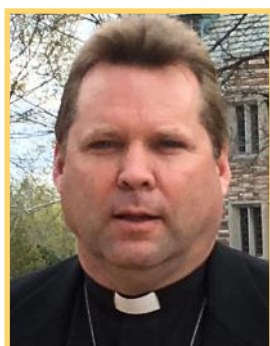

Happy New Year,

New Year celebrations have been around for thousands of years, with different cultures and civilizations celebrating the start of the year in a variety of ways. Every year in New York City the ball drops on New Years Eve. Thousands in Times Square and all over the United States and the world watch with anticipation for the New Year. The tradition of dropping a giant ball in Times Square to celebrate the new year began in 1908. The tradition can be traced back to "time balls", which were large balls lowered from tall buildings to help ship captains tell the time

The earliest recorded festivities in honor of a new year's arrival date back some 4,000 years to ancient Babylon. For the Babylonians, the first new moon following the vernal equinox (the day in late March with an equal amount of sunlight and darkness) heralded the start of a new year. They marked the occasion with a massive religious festival called Akitu (derived from the Sumerian word for barley, which was cut in the spring) that involved a different ritual on each of its 11 days.

In addition to the new year, Akitu celebrated the mythical victory of the Babylonian sky god Marduk over the evil sea goddess Tiamat and served an important political purpose: It was during this time that a new king was crowned or that the current ruler's divine mandate was symbolically renewed

Today we celebrate the New Year with confetti, horns, parties, food, liquor and of course watching the ball drop, and don't forget the fireworks. 4,000 years ago, ancient civilizations celebrated with a religious festival, they celebrated their god's victory over a evil sea goddess. As we celebrate the New Year, we can also celebrate and give thanks that our almighty God and our Lord Jesus Christ were and are forever victorious over sin, death, and the devil.

Celebrate our God the Father of Abraham the only true God. "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Psalm 134:2 Lift up your hands in the sanctuary and praise the Lord. Celebrate where God is. God found in the incarnate Christ. The Word made flesh. We find Him in His Word. The church is the holy believers who gather around a local pulpit and altar under their Shepherd's care. This happens in a place.

Are you aware that you can make a tax-free gift to Bethlehem from your 401k or IRA?

If you're 72 or older the IRS requires you to withdraw a minimum amount from your IRA/401k. This is known as a required minimum distribution or RMD. The IRS computes this annually at the beginning of the year based on your IRA/401k balance. You are taxed on this withdrawal at your regular tax rate. If you fail to withdraw this amount the tax penalty is 50% each year. However, if you make a contribution to a charity (Bethlehem Lutheran Church) as part of your RMD, you are not taxed on this amount. The contribution is known as a qualified charitable distribution or QCD. It helps ease the burden on your church contribution while it benefits Bethlehem Lutheran. Please consider this in helping the church and reducing your taxes.
