and their encounter with the Creator in this place goes before our own.



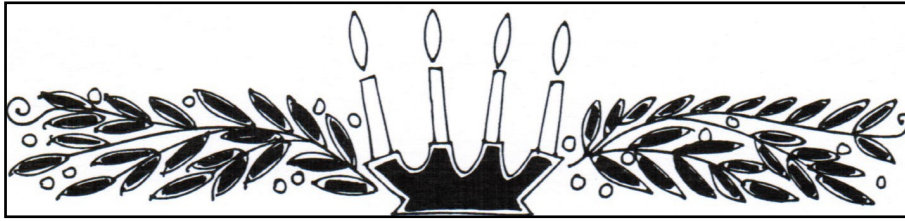

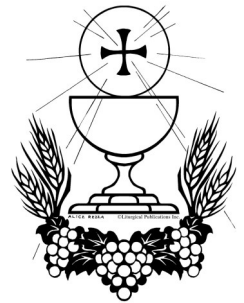
Let us confess the faith, as we say,
