

The New Year begins with a joyful celebration of the birth of Jesus that fills our hearts with hope and gratitude as we look forward to what service opportunities God is preparing for us. This remarkable document has inspired several of us as we have worked in churches and with several community organizations trying to ensure the protection of freedoms and rights of our human family.

The Universal Declaration of Human Rights consists of 30 articles that detail the fundamental rights and freedoms to which all individuals are entitled, regardless of nationality, ethnicity, or any other status. The inherent dignity of all human beings inspires movements for justice and equality worldwide.

The Preamble states: "Whereas recognition of the inherent dignity and of the equal inalienable rights of all members of the human family is the foundation of freedom, justice and peace in the world." (United Nations)

How will we live our lives this year? We remain keenly aware of our universal interdependence and the cries of those in need. Our prayer is that God will enlighten our hearts for service, deepen our faith journey, and strengthen us to love the Lord and follow where he leads.

"Let the Peace of Christ rule in your hearts." (Col 3:15)

Our congregation enjoyed the Christmas dinner that followed the Sunday school program. We had great attendance and wonderful food to share. Many thanks to everyone that participated.


