

Ancestors Who Shape and Guide Us

Then he looked up at his disciples and said:

“Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God.

“Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you will be filled.

“Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh.

“Blessed are you when people hate you and when they exclude you, revile you, and defame you on account of the Son of Man.

Rejoice on that day and leap for joy, for surely your reward is great in heaven, for that is how their ancestors treated the prophets.

Luke 6:20-23

I read a couple blog posts from the Women of the ELCA's Cafe' in preparing this Wednesday Prayer. One of these was Rev. Dr. Ralen M. Robinson's article "Women of Sacred Presence: Stories of Faith and Strength". She looks to women who have paved sacred paths, from her own ancestral line and from the line of strong and courageous women in the Bible. First, Ruth. "She lost her social standing because her husband died, traveled through a famine-torn country, and became a foreigner with no social standing. Despite her hardships, Ruth stood faithfully by her mother-in-law's side, offering her unwavering support and extending her hand to people of all cultures." We can look back now and see that Ruth was both blessed and a blessing to others. While she was poor, most likely hungry and weeping, she stood firm in her faith.

Rev. Ralen also speaks of Hagar, who "endured invalidation and bondage, crying out to God to be seen and recognized." Even after enduring rape as a slave-girl and then being thrown out of her home, Hagar cried out to God. And God heard. Hagar was seen by God and blessed.

These are remarkable stories of strength that may seem beyond our own reach. Sometimes people share with me that they don't feel like what they are doing is enough - that it is not grand enough. Is it really making a difference? This month I presented to the Southeastern Minnesota Women of the ELCA who had generously raised up Cherish All Children as their mission for gifts these past two years. They set out with a goal of raising \$4,000 to support our work. Some may have wondered if their \$20 or \$25 was enough to make a difference. Well, when they presented a check for over \$8,000, I felt remarkably blessed! Each woman received one of our Prayers for Cherishing Children

Sexual exploitation and trafficking happens everywhere not just in large communities but also in rural areas. It also affects girls, boys, LGBTQ. She referenced the story of one lost sheep, will not the shepherd leave the 99 and goes in search for the one lost sheep and rejoices when the one sheep is found. They work with law enforcement, FBI. Have guidelines, classes/tools, safety policies available for churches and communities to use for all generations. She encouraged every-



A New Hymn Celebrates WELCA: “For the Healing and Wholeness of the World”



The first recorded meeting of the church women of St. John's Lutheran in Northfield was in the fall of 1875. To celebrate the 150th anniversary, the women of St. John's commissioned a hymn based on the WELCA purpose statement. Bruce Benson, retired pastor of St. Olaf College congregation, wrote the words. David Sims, St. John's handbell choir director and the music development manager at Augsburg Fortress Publishing, composed the tune. The new hymn, “For the Healing and Wholeness of the World” was first sung at the WELCA birthday celebration at St. John's on October 11, 2025 and first sung in worship on October 12, 2025. In honor of the celebratory worship service, Bishop Regina Hassanally was the guest preacher.

Bruce Benson wrote this about the text: It's no secret that preachers regularly “borrow” language, imagery, and ideas from others. This hymn text is no exception. If you read the Purpose Statement of St. John's WELCA before reading the hymn text, you might well accuse me of blatantly stealing someone else's language. I prefer to think that what I did was harvest, not heist. The Mission Statement was a field ripe for harvest. All I did was pick it, and make it rhyme.

David Sims says this about the tune: This hymn had to be singable in a variety of settings: in the sanctuary, in St. John's Hall, in the library, in circle meetings, at homes, and with or without accompaniment in any of those places. I tried to craft something that would be durable in those circumstances and to find a melody that felt more like a folk song than a march. The lyrics repeated at the end of each stanza needed to have their own musical character, one that stopped a little longer on both the “church” and the “world” for which the women of St. John's have worked.
