



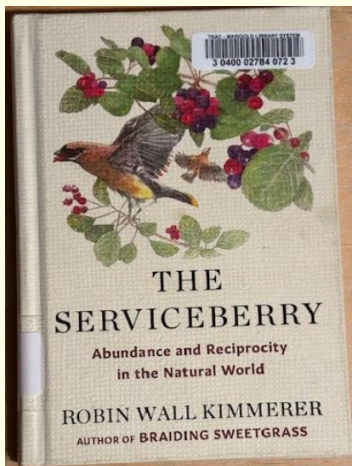

## NEWS FROM ST. ANDREW'S UNITED

Sunday evening December 21st saw thirty-eight people attend the Candlelight Service. There was no power-point that evening as we sang the familiar carols associated with this service including Silent Night as the service ended reading the words by our lit candles. Besides the carols we sang we heard Julia tell a story of a girl spreading the light to an older man.

Mark read the nativity scripture from Matthew 2:1-12 and spoke of "Follow the Star and Not the Crowd" where the seekers follow the star and not the crowd as they come from afar seeking and finding Jesus. I quote part of what Mark wrote: "Here's the beautiful part of the Magi's story: after they encountered Christ, they were changed. Scripture says they returned home "by another road." When you truly follow the star - when you truly encounter Jesus - you don't come back the same way you came... So I ask you today,...where is the star shining in your life right now?" What is our answer to this question?

On the First Sunday after Christmas service on December 28th twenty-two people joined together for the "Cut Carols and Regift" service which included the baptism of Lucas Remy Miller son of Kristian and Christine Miller. There was no message with Psalm 100 being the message. We sang some of the carols and music that we hear at this time of year with Julia giving a brief history of I Heard the Bells on Christmas Day, 'Twas in the Moon of Winter Time, Away in a Manger, Little Drummer Boy, O Holy Night, Virgin Mary Had a Baby Boy, and Do You Hear What I Hear. We also took part in re-gifting as we created our presents on a piece of paper, put them in a basket, and then drew one of these gifts from the basket at the end of the service.

The Second Sunday after Christmas service on January 4th saw twenty-six people join Julia for worship. Julia entitled her message "What's New?" and spoke from the scripture Matthew 2:1-12. We heard that the astrologers saw the star and followed it for two years before they arrived in Bethlehem. They had faith to continue to follow the star they saw rise. With hope along with expectation, they continued to follow the star. What is our expectation for this new year we have now entered? The astrologers were grounded in faith and not fear as they returned home a different way. As we are grounded in faith and not fear we are enabled to deal with any "new ways" that arise for us.
