

2025 Year-end Status


At the end of October, our congregation faced a deficit of \$73,776. A deficit means that expenses exceeded revenue for the year. To meet our budget, we needed \$223,366 in contributions during November and December. The congregation achieved \$193,674, reaching 87% of that goal. The thermometer graphic to the right visually tracks our progress toward meeting the budget goal.

Total revenue for 2025 was \$770,040, compared to the budgeted amount of \$800,000. Thanks to careful planning and diligent expense management by staff and congregation members, expenses were kept to \$788,987. This allowed us to significantly reduce our deficit compared to earlier projections

The final deficit for the year is \$18,948. This will be paid from our reserve funds, which are savings set aside for situations like this.

The Finance Committee will host a forum on **Sunday, January 18th at 9:00 AM**. At this upcoming forum, we will review this year's financial results in detail, discuss the recommended 2026 budget, and invite input from all members. Your participation is important as we plan for a stronger financial future together.

ELCA Social Statements – A Reminder:

“This church shall develop social statements … that will guide the life of this church as an institution and inform the conscience of its members in the spirit of Christian liberty.” (ELCA social statement, [“The Church in Society: A Lutheran Perspective”](#))

ELCA social statements are teaching and policy documents that provide broad frameworks to assist us in thinking about and discussing social issues in the context of faith and life. They are meant to help communities and individuals with moral formation, discernment and thoughtful engagement with current social issues as we participate in God’s work in the world. Social statements also set policy for the ELCA and guide its advocacy and work as a publicly engaged church. They result from an extensive process of participation and deliberation and are adopted by a two-thirds vote of an ELCA churchwide assembly.

The most recent statement, [Civic Life and Faith](#), was adopted by the 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly.

We encourage you to read the social statements to learn more about how we as church engage with the world.

Sunday Morning Bible Study is back! We will meet again to study the "Lost Parables" in Luke 15 on Sunday, January 11th, at 9:00 a.m.





(Share this with friends, too) **To reiterate, even if you signed up on paper, you must now sign up digitally, using the QR code.**

HOW TO PREPARE FOR BLOOD DONATION APPOINTMENT

- Hydrate by drinking plenty of fluids for 24 hours
- Eat salty snacks the night before
- Get a good night's rest
- Eat a good breakfast (or lunch depending on app't time)
- Bring picture ID
- Fill out Quickpass at time of appointment (a health questionnaire).

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

- Should have generally good health and be feeling well day of appointment
- Plan to undergo a confidential screening interview and mini health check of blood pressure, pulse, temp, and iron level.
- Not everyone is eligible to donate. Some factors are health conditions, meds, or recent travel. Again check link and phone number as noted above for specifics.
- Consider also checking in with your healthcare provider.

WEIGHT REQUIREMENTS:

- At least 110 pounds

AGE REQUIREMENTS

- 18 years. No upper age limit
- 16 and 17 year olds can donate with permission forms, provided by Bloodworks NW. Parent or guardian must sign.
