The Preparation

Officiant

Harriet Bedell was born in Buffalo, New York on March 19, 1875. Inspired by an Episcopal missionary, she enrolled as a student at the New York Training School for Deaconesses, receiving instruction in religion, missions, teaching, and health. She then became a missionary-teacher among the Cheyenne at the Whirlwind Mission in Oklahoma, where she was eventually adopted into the tribe as “Bird Woman.” In 1916, Bedell was sent to Stevens Village, Alaska, where she was set apart as a deaconess in 1922. She also served as a teacher and nurse at St. John’s in the Wilderness at Allakaket, 40 miles south of the Arctic Circle. In 1932, hearing about the plight of the Seminoles in Florida, Bedell used her own salary to reopen a mission among the Mikasuki first nation. There, she worked to revive some of their traditional crafts. The store they established to sell their handicrafts improved the economy of the Blades Cross Mission. Active into her eighties, she was one of the most popular writers in the Episcopal mission periodical, “The Spirit of Missions”. She won the respect of indigenous people through her compassion and respect for their way of life and beliefs. The Diocese of Southwest Florida has long celebrated Harriet Bedell Day on January 8, the anniversary of her death in 1969.

Reader

Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled. Blessed are the merciful, for they will receive mercy. Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God. Blessed are those who are persecuted for the sake of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are you when people revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account. Rejoice and be glad, for your reward is great in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.”
