Words From the Word #49

From Matthew 5:11 – teaching the last beatitude Jesus says, “Blessed are you when they revile and persecute you, and say all kinds of evil against you falsely for My sake.” The Greek word for revile is *oneidizo*. It literally means to cast in one’s teeth. To cast in one’s teeth. In other words, it’s to throw something in your face, it is what it is. It’s used in the crucifixion of Christ in Matthew 27:44. They cast in His teeth. They mocked Him. They made fun of Him. They reviled Him. They scorned Him. It’s to abuse somebody with vile, vicious, mocking words. That’s essentially what it means. So we not only are going to be chased out of the groups we used to be in. Not only that, but there are also going to be people who are going to speak evil of us, they’re going to say things about us, they’re going to use unkind words when our name comes up. They did it with Jesus. They said, “Ah, He hangs around with prostitutes and tax collectors,” and so forth. So if you’re going to live the Beatitude life, you’ve got to be willing to be persecuted and reviled, and there are going to be some people who are going to say unkind things about you. Some people you may even care about.

From Acts 1:8 – “you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.” “You shall be *mou martyres*.” My what? “Martyrs.” There’s a price to pay to follow Jesus.

From Daniel 7:9 - Let’s go to that coronation scene of Jesus Christ, “I watched till thrones were” – and literally in the Aramaic – we’re still in Aramaic for a little while here [chapter 8 and beyond will be in Hebrew]– “I watched/beheld till the thrones were thrown down” – literally cast down – “And the Ancient of Days was seated, His garment was white as snow, And the hair of His head was like pure wool. His throne was a fiery flame, Its wheels a burning fire. ¹⁰ A fiery stream issued And came forth from before Him. A thousand thousands ministered to Him; Ten thousand times ten thousand stood before Him. The court was seated, And the books were opened.”

Now, I want you to see this part, “I watched till thrones were put in place, And the Ancient of Days was seated” Now listen, that’s a fascinating insight. Do you see that little verb “thrones were put in place?” Some versions translate that “thrown down”. And thus, some people think that means that this is the destruction of a throne. But not at all.

If you were to go into an Arab country today, you go into the Middle East today, and this occurred in the Middle East – in fact, it occurred east of the Middle East, not far from India – but if you were to go into that part of the world today, and some very, very important person – a king, a shah, a sheik or whoever, even an ayatollah were to appear, you would find that his throne was cast down in this sense: cushion and pillows would be thrown down as the place where he would sit. This is oriental fashion. A throne is established, and the Ancient of Days takes His place on that throne. Also, you see the term “Ancient of Days used here several times. Ancient of Days, *attiq yomayya*. This simply has to do with one who is old in age. That’s all it means, one who is old in age. You could even translate it, believe it or not, the Old One. The Old One. But I really believe it’s a biblical reference to God’s eternalness. And the one who is eternal is none other than God Himself, the eternal God who sits in judgment.

The Editor forgot to include this picture in the last newsletter. In October we celebrated “Pastor Appreciation” but we should show our appreciation for our Teacher/Preacher more often, right?!?!

The One Word on Which Jesus Built Everything

There's a word we don't use much anymore—at least not in a positive way. The word is *obedience*. For many, it sounds old-fashioned or restrictive, something that belongs to childhood or rule books, not to grown-up faith.

But Jesus thought differently. In fact, He built His entire message on the idea that hearing God's Word isn't enough. Life, real life, comes from *doing* what He says.

That truth is uncomfortable, but it's also freeing. Jesus wasn't calling people into joyless rule-keeping. He was offering something stronger than emotions, opinions, or good intentions. He was offering a foundation that could hold up when life's storms hit.

Most of us know His story of the wise and foolish builders. Both men listened to Jesus. Both built houses. Both faced wind and rain. The only difference—the *only* difference—was obedience. One acted on what he heard, and his house stood firm. The other didn't, and his world collapsed around him.

It's hard not to see ourselves in that picture. We live in a world filled with spiritual noise—podcasts, sermons, devotionals, posts, opinions. We hear so much. But Jesus teaches that the blessing isn't in the hearing. It's in the doing. It's in taking His words seriously enough to shape the way we speak, forgive, serve, repent, trust, and love.

If that sounds heavy, remember this: Jesus never asks us to walk a path He hasn't walked Himself. Before He ever called us to obey, *He* obeyed His Father perfectly. From the wilderness temptation to the garden anguish, Jesus kept saying, "Not My will, but Yours be done." His obedience didn't earn the Father's love—it revealed it. And through faith, His obedience becomes the hope and confidence of every believer.

That means something wonderfully freeing: our standing with God never rests on our shaky attempts at obedience. It rests on Jesus' perfect obedience, offered for us and shared with us as we trust and follow Him. We obey not to be loved, but because we already are.

Even so, Jesus never softens His call. At the end of His Sermon on the Mount, He leaves us with a question that brings the whole issue into focus—a question that exposes what kind of foundation we're really building on:

"Why do you call Me 'Lord, Lord,' and do not do what I say?" (Luke 6:46)

It's a searching question, yet a gracious one. It reminds us that obedience is not the enemy of freedom but the doorway into it. And it invites us, again, to hear His words—and to follow Him with all our hearts.

Setting Goals for Fruitful Living

Spend time alone with God in His Word, wait in silence for His guidance, and He will speak to your heart.

2 Samuel 7:18-22

Second Samuel 7 tells us that David spent time alone with God, offering praise and thanksgiving. He also listened as the Lord revealed truth and offered insight about the future. Because of the things he learned, David was able to set goals and stay aligned with them.

When was the last time you spent time in solitude with the Lord, remaining silent and listening intently for His guidance ([Psalm 46:10](#))? Ask Him to speak to you about His plans, and He will answer.

Are you unsure of how to begin? First, come before the throne of almighty God in prayer with a repentant heart, and express your praise and thanksgiving. Second, spend time each day in His Word, letting Him refine your spiritual eyes. Finally, ask Him for direction in any area of your life. Wait patiently and attentively, knowing that He will give you His wisdom. Most often His guidance is experienced as a prodding or conviction in the heart—it's a truly priceless experience.

In order to stay on the right path, we should stop, ask, and listen for guidance. And to avoid confusion, we need to check our course frequently. These conversations with the Lord are vital for a thriving and impactful life.

Three years ago, the Prayer Shawl Ministry made its first appearance at NLFWC. The pattern and concept is a simple one – knit 3 stitches – purl 3 stitches – representing the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. A prayer is lifted with each stitch created, and the finished shawl is then covered by a special prayer/blessing delivered by Pastor Steve. To date, we have been given the opportunity to present 114 shawls with the hope that the recipients have experienced peace, comfort, love and joy from them. Baked Potato Skins

(Shared by Jennifer Lundberg)

4 large baked potatoes
3 tbsp olive oil
1 tbsp dry parmesan
½ tsp salt
¼ tsp garlic powder
¼ tsp paprika
¼ tsp black pepper



Toppings of your choice: we like bacon, shredded cheddar, green onions, sour cream

Cut potatoes in half and scoop them out completely. Place on greased cookie sheet. Combine oil, cheese and all seasonings and brush over both sides of the potatoes. Bake at 475 for 7 minutes, turn over and bake another 7 minutes. Sprinkle the inside of the skins with cheese and bacon. Bake 2 minutes or until melted and sizzling. Load with the rest of your toppings and enjoy!

Green Sauce

(Shared by Deb Zink)

3 medium green tomatoes
4 tomatillos
1 to 2 jalapeños
3 small garlic cloves

3 ripe avocados, mashed
4 sprigs cilantro
1 tsp. salt
1 1/2 c. sour cream

Coarsely chop the tomatoes (you can substitute yellow if you can't find green ones, but never use red), tomatillos, garlic and jalapeños. Place in skillet and bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer for 15 minutes, stirring occasionally. Remove from heat and let cool slightly. Combine tomato mixture with the avocados, cilantro and salt in food processor or blender and blend until smooth. Pour into a bowl and stir in sour cream. Serve immediately or chill. Delicious with tortilla chips, grilled meats, fish and just about anything else you care to put it on.

NOTE-I have also added 1 lb. of chopped nopalitas (prickly pear cactus pods) with an additional 1/2 c. of sour cream.

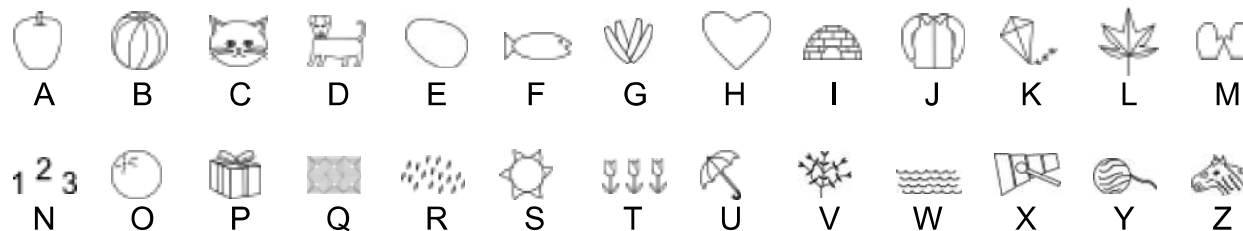

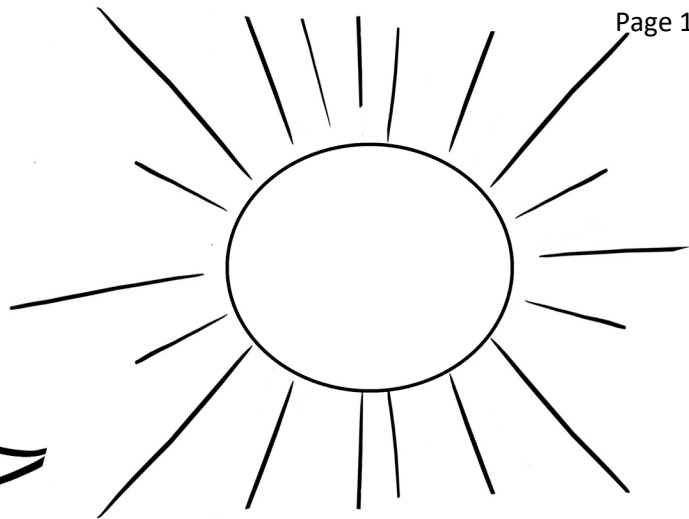
