



Vicar's Voice

Can you remember?

Imagine how chaotic our lives would be if we were not able to remember anything? **Think of the implications:** there would be no

learning or growing, and we would not be able to retain any knowledge of previous behaviour. Further, meaningful and lasting relationships would be virtually impossible. Though the sting of painful events would never linger, we would also never be able to savor positive experiences or identify with others who were experiencing pain and suffering!

The Scriptures “**remind**” us of the importance of **memory**. And, more importantly, that we never forget Who God is and what He has done. Jewish leaders still to this day place a band around their head -containing which holds the word of God. **This precious box**, enables them to remember the Word of the Lord.

As followers of Jesus, we are urged to ponder what God has done for us in our lives. One of the practical ways to help us remember is through the **memorization of scripture**. I will be forever thankful to my parents and aunt and uncle who encouraged me to commit to memorizing Scripture. Because of that discipline early on, I am able now to **recall helpful and meaningful Scriptures at most important times**.

Having a knowledge of Scripture helps us to see what God sees. And, as we read Scripture, we realize that there is a conversation taking place. God is speaking to us. **If we listen carefully, we can hear Him**. So, as we learn His word, it begins to take root in our lives. God draws it back to our minds such that we can have the opportunity to apply it at the appropriate time – whether it be a time of worship and praise, or as a means of encouraging us or other in a time of need, or even as we are making an important decision in our lives and are seeking God’s wisdom and strength in that process.

The Scriptures anchor us. They remind us that **God is with us** and is able to ground us in this ever changing and increasingly chaotic world.

So, as I was encouraged, I encourage you. I wonder how your life would be impacted if you committed some verses to memory? My prayer is that as you learn more and more, **God would meet you there and teach you from His very heart**.

May the Word of the Lord always nourish you.
