Jan's Journal



On this first Sunday after Epiphany, we celebrate the Baptism of Jesus, which officially marks the beginning of Jesus' ministry in the world.

The Community Connections Team (formerly known as the Community Hub Ad Hoc Committee) has begun a process of tidying and de-cluttering spaces within our building in preparation for the exploration of new partnerships with the Aldershot community. You are invited to get involved and assist with this process. Please contact Karen Maerz or any member of the Team. In addition to working on de-cluttering and organizing the space, the Community Connections Team is working with Community Development Halton to plan a "Round Table" discussion event. This will be planned for the near future. It will be an opportunity for representatives of various organizations within the community to meet with representatives of East Plains to discuss their needs for space and the space that is available within the church, as we investigate possible partnerships.

In conjunction with these avenues of inquiry, I strongly believe that we also need to seek God's guidance in determining a way forward for East Plains. To help us to listen for God's nudges, I will offer a day of contemplative prayer on Saturday, January 31st between 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. During this time, you will have an opportunity to learn the technique of "praying with scripture", also known as Lectio Divina (Divine Reading) or Gospel Contemplation. There will also be some education about the history and meaning of the Labyrinth and an opportunity to walk a Labyrinth in Peart Hall. Please mark your calendar and plan to attend! Also, please invite neighbours, friends, family members, anyone whom you think would be interested.

I also met with Reverend Carolin Macmillan, minister at Appleby United Church, last Wednesday to begin planning "A Week of Guided Prayer" to be held jointly. We have chosen the week of May 3rd -May 9th, 2026. A "Week of Guided Prayer" requires the commitment of approximately ½ an hour of prayer, in the form of "Praying with Scripture" on your own at home each day, followed by a meeting

with a trained Companion to discuss and deepen your prayer experience. The week will follow a particular theme. There are specific scripture passages offered each day from which you will choose one passage to focus upon. It is best to meet with your Companion in person, at the church for your discussion time, however, there will be Companions available to meet on Zoom, for those who find it a challenge to come in person.

The week begins on Sunday afternoon with an Opening Service which includes training in how to "Pray with Scripture," and pairing with your Companion for the week. The Week finishes with a Closing Service on Saturday.

The Opening Service will be held at Appleby United Church on Sunday May 3, 2026. This will be an afternoon event. The time will be determined closer to the date. The Closing Service will be held at East Plains United Church on Saturday, May 9th, between 9 a.m. and noon.

We will need trained Prayer Companions to accompany participants throughout the week. I will be leading a Companion Training Session on Saturday, March 28th, 2026, here at East Plains.

A "Week of Guided Prayer" is described as a "retreat in the midst of daily life." It has been offered through the "Week of Guided Prayer Network" in affiliation with Hamilton Conference, and more recently, Horseshoe Falls Regional Council, for more than 30 years.

I personally experienced "A Week of Guided Prayer" for the first time in November 2003. The experience was, for me, a transformative one. I became trained as a Companion and then a Co-ordinator. I was involved in bringing "A Week of Guided Prayer" to Appleby United Church in 2004 and each year thereafter until 2014. I also served as a Prayer

Companion in “weeks” at other churches in this area. I was invited to join the “Week of Guided Prayer” planning team, and have participated in developing themes and resources for the “weeks” each year for nearly 20 years. My experience as a Companion for “A Week of Guided Prayer” was instrumental to my becoming trained as a Spiritual Director and establishing a Spiritual Direction practice. I highly recommend the experience! I hope that you will prayerfully consider participating in this “Week of Guided Prayer” in 2026. We have decided to follow the resource materials for “Hope,” as it seemed appropriate for this time. Stay tuned for more information as the planning progresses!

Continuing with the subject of prayer----A Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, which is an annual, international tradition, will begin on Sunday, January 18th, 2026---which is just a week away! The services have been written by the Armenian Church. Everyone is welcome to attend any or all of these services. The schedule is as follows:

Sunday, January 18th -----Opening Service at Appleby United Church at 2 p.m.

Monday, January 19th----evening service at Grace United Church at 7 p.m.

Tuesday, January 20th --- evening service at St. Raphael's Roman Catholic Church at 7 p.m.

Wednesday, January 21st--- evening service at Burlington Anglican Lutheran Church at 7 p.m.

Thursday, January 22nd--- evening service at Archangel Raphaela and St. Marina Coptic Orthodox Church at 7 p.m.

Sunday, January 25th--- a Taizé service at Port Nelson United Church at 4:30 p.m.
