Safe Space provides emergency overnight shelter rotating through churches during the coldest months of the winter. They are a first-come, first-serve shelter but prioritize those with extreme vulnerability, putting them at too great a risk to sleep outside. The shelter is currently operational and is scheduled to run through March 1, with our church hosting from January 18-February 1.
