## Moderator's Moment: Looking Ahead to 2026

The Church Council met on Monday, December 8th, in the Fellowship Hall to discuss our shared ministry and upcoming business. As we prepare for our **Annual Meeting on Sunday, January 25th, 2026**, I would like to invite the congregation to prayerfully consider several important updates.

### **Our 2026 Stewardship Campaign**

A central part of our Annual Meeting is establishing a sustainable budget for the coming year. In 2025, our stewardship campaign secured \$103,000 in pledges. However, to keep pace with rising operating costs and to fully support our vital new **Director of Faith Formation** position without relying on savings, we must grow our collective giving.

Our pledge goal for 2026 is **\$125,000**. As of mid-December, we have received \$86,000 in commitments.

- **To those who have already pledged:** Thank you for your generosity.
- **To those still considering:** It is not too late to help us reach our goal.

Together, we can bring this year's theme to life: *"Dreaming God's Dream: No Gift Too Small, No Dream Too Big."*

### **Serving Together: Committee Volunteers Needed**

As the saying goes, "Many hands make light work." Our committees are the engine of our congregation, but several are currently shorthanded. We are seeking:

- **Missions Committee:** At least 1 new member.
- **Christian Life Committee:** 2 to 3 new members.

## BROOKFIELD ECUMENICAL FOOD PANTRY



FOOD PANTRY

The B.E.F.P. is an all volunteer organization. It was created by the churches in Brookfield to help those who find themselves in need of supplementary food and/or household supplies. The B.E.F.P. is open on **Wednesdays and Saturdays from 9:30 - 11:00 AM.**

There are no requirements, such as income, other than that you are a Brookfield or East Brookfield resident. You are also allowed to come monthly. Many, many people donate goods and/or money to the B.E.F.P. Also, other groups and businesses donate to the pantry - groups such as; school students, scouts, state police, banks and other organizations. Money allows us to purchase non-food household items such as soap, paper goods, cleaning supplies and other items not covered by S.N.A.P. (food stamps).

Once a month, devoted volunteers travel to the Worcester County Food Bank in Shrewsbury. There, we are able to obtain a lot of food to help replenish our shelves at very little or no cost. We are located at 4 Howard Street, Brookfield, MA 01506.

## Living Our Faith Through Giving: Heifer International Partnership

Our children and congregation partnered with Heifer International this year to live out our faith through giving. Through fundraising and VBS, we raised \$2,500 to provide livestock, clean

water, education, and sustainable resources to families around the world.

We're so proud of our students for choosing gifts that reflect compassion, stewardship, and God's love for all. Thank you to everyone who supported this meaningful mission!

Hope Basket (\$50): Rabbits and a starter flock of chickens, along with training and education

Gift of Clean Water (\$300): Support for treadle pumps, water conservation, and organic fertilizers

Two Gifts of a Water Buffalo (\$250 each). These water buffalo will provide rich, protein-filled milk and help make farming easier by tilling fields and producing natural fertilizer—further strengthening long-term sustainability.

Mating Pair of Cattle (\$1,000): A heifer and a bull to improve the productivity of a struggling farm and provide valuable offspring

Two Sheep (\$240): Wool and milk to provide clothing and nourishment for families living in harsh environments

Community Animal Health Worker Kit (\$200): Education and materials to keep animals in the community safe and healthy

Garden Seeds (\$60): Fruit and vegetable seedlings with education about healthy soil

Earth Gift Basket (\$60): A hive of bees and tree seedlings to increase crop production while caring for the Earth

Women's Self-Help Group (\$72): This gift provides a community with a group for women where they receive the education and support necessary to create better lives for themselves and their families.

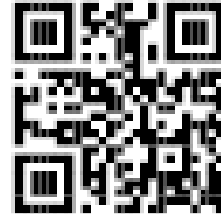
