- † John 17:1, “Jesus spoke these things; and lifting up His eyes to heaven, He said, ‘Father, the hour has come; glorify Your Son, that the Son may glorify You’” (NASB).
- † John 14:27, ““Peace I leave with you; My peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Do not let your heart be troubled, nor let it be fearful” (NASB).
- † John 13:34-35, ““A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another, even as I have loved you, that you also love one another. <sup>35</sup>By this all men will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another” (NASB).
- † John 14:1, “Do not let your heart be troubled; believe in God, believe also in Me” (NASB).
- † John 15:5, “I am the vine, you are the branches; he who abides in Me and I in him, he bears much fruit, for apart from Me you can do nothing” (NASB).
- † John 16:13, “But when He, the Spirit of truth, comes, He will guide you into all the truth; for He will not speak on His own initiative, but whatever He hears, He will speak; and He will disclose to you what is to come” (NASB).

**We Are The Answer To Jesus' Prayer In John 17 . . .**

**1. When God is getting the \_\_\_\_\_ (John 17:1).**

- The word “glory” is used \_\_\_\_\_ times in Jesus’ prayer.
- The word “glory” is the Greek New Testament word is [οξάζω; doxazō]. It is where we get our English word \_\_\_\_\_. To be glorified means to \_\_\_\_\_ hidden values and hidden riches.

**Jesus Wants To Reveal His Glory In 3 Primary Ways**

- (a) \_\_\_\_\_ us on the cross. For Jesus the cross was a place of \_\_\_\_\_, not just \_\_\_\_\_.
- (b) \_\_\_\_\_ us through His Resurrection (John 17:24).
- (c) \_\_\_\_\_ us to others. The road to God’s glory in our personal lives is caught up in one word — \_\_\_\_\_.

- † Philippians 2:8, “Being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself by becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross” (NASB).
- † John 17:4, “I glorified You on the earth, having accomplished the work which You have given Me to do” (NASB).
- † John 17:2-3, “Even as You gave Him authority over all flesh, that to all whom You have given Him, He may give eternal life. <sup>3</sup>This is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent” (NASB).
- † John 17:6, “I have manifested Your name to the men whom You gave Me out of the world; they were Yours and You gave them to Me, and they have kept Your word” (NASB).

**2. When we are living in \_\_\_\_\_, not uncertainty (John 17:11-12).**

- Jesus prayed for our protection. How? By the power of God’s \_\_\_\_\_.
- † John 17:11a, “I am no longer in the world; and yet they themselves are in the world, and I come to You. Holy Father, keep them in Your name” (NASB).
- The Greek New Testament word translated as “keep” is [τηρέω; tēreō] and it means “to keep watch over in order to guard or protect.”

**What Does God Protect His Disciples From?**

- (a) Jesus protects us from the \_\_\_\_\_ (John 17:11a).
- † John 16:33b, “In the world you have tribulation, but take courage; I have overcome the world” (NASB).

- The Greek New Testament word translated as “world” is [κόσμος; kosmos]. It can refer to the planet, but most of the time in the Bible this word refers to people who live without Christ, it refers to the evil and sin in this world. \_\_\_\_\_ times in this prayer, Jesus uses the word “world.”

(b) Jesus protects us from the \_\_\_\_\_ and the \_\_\_\_\_ (John 17:14-15).

### Why Does God Protect His Disciples?

- (a) That they may be \_\_\_\_\_ (John 17:21).
- (b) That they have His \_\_\_\_\_ (John 17:13).

+ Hebrews 12:1, “Let us run with endurance the race that is set before us” (NASB).

### 3. When we grow in \_\_\_\_\_ (John 17:17-19).

- “Sanctify” The Greek New Testament word is [ἅγιάζω; hagiazō] and it means “to be set apart for a specific purpose by and for God with the power of God to fulfill God’s purpose.”
- Jesus’ point is that \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_ go together.

### How Does Jesus Sanctify Us?

- (a) By Jesus’ \_\_\_\_\_, which is biblical truth (John 17:17)

+ Romans 8:34, “It was Christ Jesus Who died. He was raised from the dead. He is on the right side of God praying to Him for us” (NLT).

### 4. When we gain in \_\_\_\_\_ (John 17:22, 24).

- Jesus’ promises of the assurance of heaven are seen in John 3:16, John 14:1-3.
- + Luke 19:10, “For the Son of Man came to seek and save those who are lost” (NLT).
