Well, we are 11 days into the New Year; how many of us have dropped the ball on our New Year's resolutions? Speaking of ball drops, do you know where that tradition's iconic symbol came from? In 1907, fireworks were banned from being used over the New Year's crowd. Needing a way to ring in the new year that everyone could observe from afar, someone suggested a "time ball" and the *New York Times* owner, Adolph Ochs, introduced the iconic symbol. Time balls were used in the late 1800's to communicate the current time. The ball was dropped at 1:00 PM (or at noon in some areas). This allowed ships to calibrate the chronometers for accurate navigation. Precise timekeeping is necessary for determining longitude.

Ships would calibrate their chronometers before leaving port. Environmental conditions could lead to inaccuracies in chronometers, so they had to be constantly verified to prove their resilience. Much in the same way, we must keep our focus in check by seeking God constantly. The world can sometimes skew our moral compass. As Christians, we have a "time ball" too. God gave us His word to keep us calibrated in His will.

"Your word is a lamp for my feet, a light on my path." - [Psalm 119:105](#).

Can we make some parallels to New Year's and our walk with Christ? At New Year's, many of us make "resolutions" of things we want to change or improve in our lives. Likewise, after we commit ourselves to Christ, He starts to reveal things in us that need to be cleaned up. As Pastor Jon said a few weeks ago, we come to Him as we are, and He will clean us up. If you've ever made a New Year's resolution, you know that you don't just decide to do better and magically it just happens. It takes daily work and commitment to keep those resolutions. When it comes to our walk with Christ, it's a continuous change. You don't just wake up and BOOM! You're just like Jesus! Like the song said "He's Still Working on Me".

The point is, we can't just rely on ourselves to stay on course. We need a "time ball" to keep us aligned. Even as we improve the areas God reveals to us, we must continue to move forward, seeking new ways to become more like Him. It's not enough to set our clocks one time. We have to stay in His Word to navigate this world.
