ORDER OF WORSHIP

Time for Centering

This week we continue our sermon series on the Lord's Prayer by reflecting on its opening petition, "Hallowed be your name." When Jesus teaches us to pray, he begins by reorienting our hearts toward God—toward God's holiness, glory, and deep worth.

Before we ask for daily bread or forgiveness, we are invited to remember who God is and to learn what it means to honor God's name with reverence and trust.

*To hallow God's name is more than careful speech or right belief; it is a way of life shaped by awe, obedience, and love. As **Eugene Peterson** reminds us, "Prayer is not a way of getting what we want but a way of being formed by what God wants." Prayer reshapes our desires so that God's holiness is reflected not only in worship, but in how we live.*

*Our Scripture for the day, **John 12:20–28**, brings this petition into sharp focus as Jesus prays, "Father, glorify your name," even as he faces suffering and the cross. In this moment, God's name is hallowed not through power or spectacle, but through self-giving love and faithful obedience.*

*As **Dallas Willard** writes, "The first and most basic thing we can and must do is to keep God before our minds." This Sunday we will consider how prayer draws our attention back to God's glory, shaping lives that bear God's holy name with humility, faithfulness, and hope.*

Attendance at last Sunday's service was 243; 218 joined online.



Legacy Endowment Fund – current balance \$378,952

The purpose of the Endowment Fund is to expand and enrich the mission of the congregation, to initiate new ministries or significantly change the scope of existing ministries. No more than 5% of the three year average fund assets may be distributed in any one year.

Memorial Garden Fund – current balance \$482,645

The purpose of the Memorial Garden Fund is to provide for the perpetual operation and maintenance of the Memorial Garden. Established in 1990, the Memorial Garden provides a resting place for the interment of the ashes of loved ones. It is open to current and former members and residents of Rio and Tonto Verde.

Scholarship Fund – current balance \$20,153

The Scholarship Fund promotes scholarships among young people involved in institutions we support through Mission giving. Recipients are chosen from applicants who are demonstrating academic excellence, commitment, and service in or to one of the following non-profit institutions or community: Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA), NPH (formerly Friends of the Orphans), Sunshine Acres. The Scholarship Fund's sole support is contributions from our members. Donors cannot be related to recipients.

Did you know?... If you are age 70 1/2 or older, you can make a gift from your IRA to support the church. It will not add to your federal taxable income; It counts toward your required minimum distribution, and allows you to experience a tax benefit, even if you do not itemize deductions. You should discuss any such gifts, before making them, with your financial advisor.

The church is very appreciative of gifts from trusts, foundations, and stocks. Occasionally, these gifts are received with no indication of who the donor is. So that we may properly recognize and record the gift, we ask that you either notify the church office or have your financial representative document the donor {and intent} when it is sent to us.


