


Historical Record 2025



January: Pastors Rick and Serena went on a trip sponsored by the United Lutheran Seminary called, "In the Footsteps of Paul and Revelation: A New Testament Journey," which saw them travelling across the countries of Turkey and Greece. After they returned home, they put together a comprehensive presentation for Lent, which they presented at both Town Line Lutheran and Trinity throughout the Lenten season. There were five presentations held at 10 am at Town Line and 6 pm at Trinity. Trinity members enjoyed a soup supper prior to the presentation each week.



January – May 15th - *Bible Study* continued on Thursday mornings at 10 am. We continued to study the book of Acts through March 13th. In Lent, we switched to a five-week series called "Give Me a Newheart" based on the 80s TV series "Newhart" that focused on how we can turn back towards God, with a different focus each week.

Sunday, January 5th: The Sunday School put on its annual ***Christmas Program*** (The Pageant for All) with a light reception following in the Fellowship Hall. This year, the congregation participated by supplying noises and interacting when prompted by the reader, Jane Dorr.

Sunday, January 26th: Our ***annual church meeting*** and pot-luck was held, at which time, new council members were elected, and the revised constitution was approved. The 2025 proposed budget was also voted on and passed.

Wednesday March 5th: We marked today with our ***Ash Wednesday*** worship at 7:00 pm, including the imposition of ashes.

Sunday February 9th: *The Souper Bowl of Caring*- Trinity continued to participate in the Souper Bowl program by setting up 2 soup kettles in the back of the sanctuary for worshippers to place money in, depending on which team they thought would win. The money collected went to the Lutheran World Relief to help the people of California who lost everything in the devastating wildfires.

2025 Lenten Drive: This year we joined our Upstate New York Synod churches in raising money to support the Lutheran Church in Zimbabwe and their effort to provide proper medical care for our siblings in Christ. The donations raised went toward purchasing ambulances for a remote region in Zimbabwe to keep access to their hospitals.

Saturday April 5th: *Our Spaghetti Supper & Basket Raffle*- 2025 was a great success bringing in \$2534 total between the Supper and Basket Raffle! It was well attended. We had over 70 baskets this time! We had a lot of folks from the community who really seemed to enjoy it. The sauce was as delicious as always! April 6th: We held a brief ***congregational meeting*** following worship to vote on proposed revisions to our newly ratified constitution.

April 7th: Ronda Lauridsen, assisted by Tracy Dorr, created a new ***Women's Group*** that met for the first time at 7:00 pm. The group is a low-key, fun 1–2-hour meeting where women can share stories and laughter and choose a question to answer about how God is present in our lives. April 12th: ***Indoor Church Cleanup*** – spearheaded by Lois Kruschke, a group of volunteers spent the morning beautifying the inside of the church, including Dale and Lois Kruschke, Tammy Hohannes, Becky Fix, Jennifer Kleparek, Donna Kumpf and Marilyn Plateau. Thank you all!

Sunday April 13th: *Palm Sunday* – With 55 in attendance, we began our 9:30am service with a procession of the palms up the stairs from the foyer to the sanctuary, singing All Glory, Laud, and Honor.

Thursday April 17th: *Maundy Thursday* – worship at 7 pm, 20 in attendance. We had holy communion and the symbolic stripping of the altar.

Thursday April 17th: *Flower Pickup*. The florist we used previously retired, so we began working with a new florist called The New Leaf Greenhouse. This meant we would be picking up our own flowers, thanks to the generosity of Dale and Lois Kruschke, Tammy Johannes, Becky Fix, Pastor Rick and Laura Mollenkopf-Grill, Sue and Jim Kidder and Tracy and Annaleigh Kittel, we took our little group to the greenhouse and picked up the flowers. June 14th: The annual ***Akron Sidewalk Sale***. Trinity had their usual table at the sidewalk sale with Buck-A-Box items from 9am-3pm. Volunteers including Donna Kumpf, Ronda Lauridsen, Paula Jendrowski and Lois Kruschke, Linda Finger and Carolyn Finger wrapped the boxes and manned the stand. The items were \$1.00 or more value, in shoeboxes wrapped with newspaper, and kids and adults get the surprise of unwrapping to see what item they ended up with. 
