ELCA Social Statements – A Reminder:

“This church shall develop social statements ... that will guide the life of this church as an institution and inform the conscience of its members in the spirit of Christian liberty.” (ELCA social statement, “[The Church in Society: A Lutheran Perspective](#)”)

ELCA social statements are teaching and policy documents that provide broad frameworks to assist us in thinking about and discussing social issues in the context of faith and life. They are meant to help communities and individuals with moral formation, discernment and thoughtful engagement with current social issues as we participate in God’s work in the world. Social statements also set policy for the ELCA and guide its advocacy and work as a publicly engaged church. They result from an extensive process of participation and deliberation and are adopted by a two-thirds vote of an ELCA churchwide assembly.

The most recent statement, [Civic Life and Faith](#), was adopted by the 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly. We encourage you to read the social statements to learn more about how we as church engage with the world.

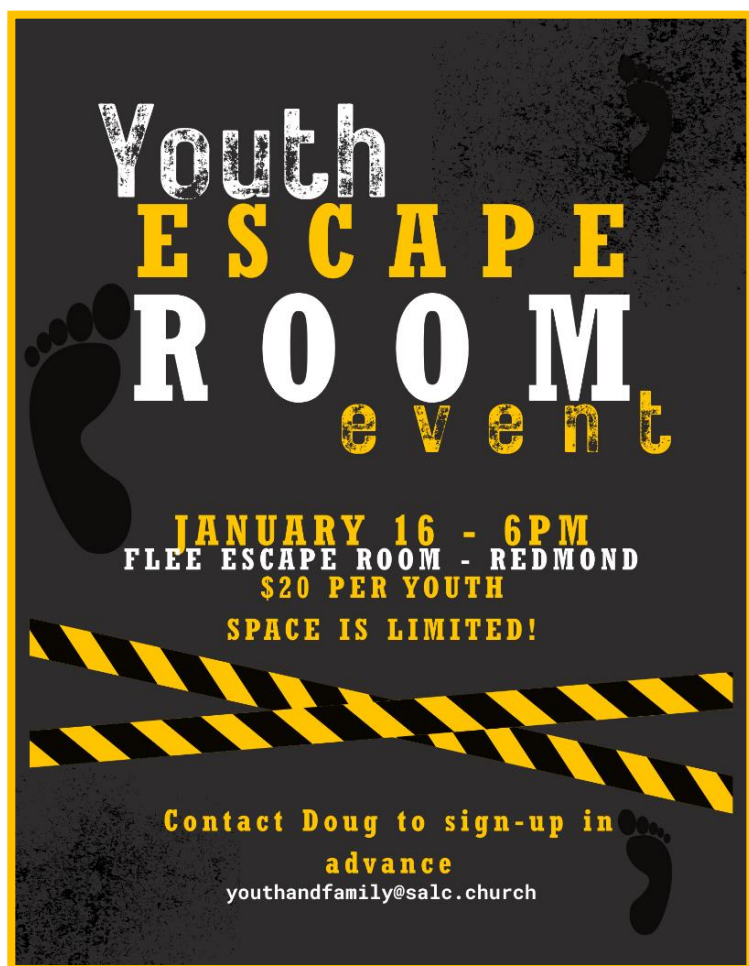

HOW TO PREPARE FOR BLOOD DONATION APPOINTMENT

- Hydrate by drinking plenty of fluids for 24 hours
- Eat salty snacks the night before
- Get a good night's rest
- Eat a good breakfast (or lunch depending on app't time)
- Bring picture ID
- Fill out Quickpass at time of appointment (a health questionnaire).

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

- Should have generally good health and be feeling well day of appointment
- Plan to undergo a confidential screening interview and mini health check of blood pressure, pulse, temp, and iron level.
- Not everyone is eligible to donate. Some factors are health conditions, meds, or recent travel. Again check link and phone number as noted above for specifics.
- Consider also checking in with your healthcare provider.

WEIGHT REQUIREMENTS:

- At least 110 pounds

AGE REQUIREMENTS

- 18 years. No upper age limit
- 16 and 17 year olds can donate with permission forms, provided by Bloodworks NW. Parent or guardian must sign.
