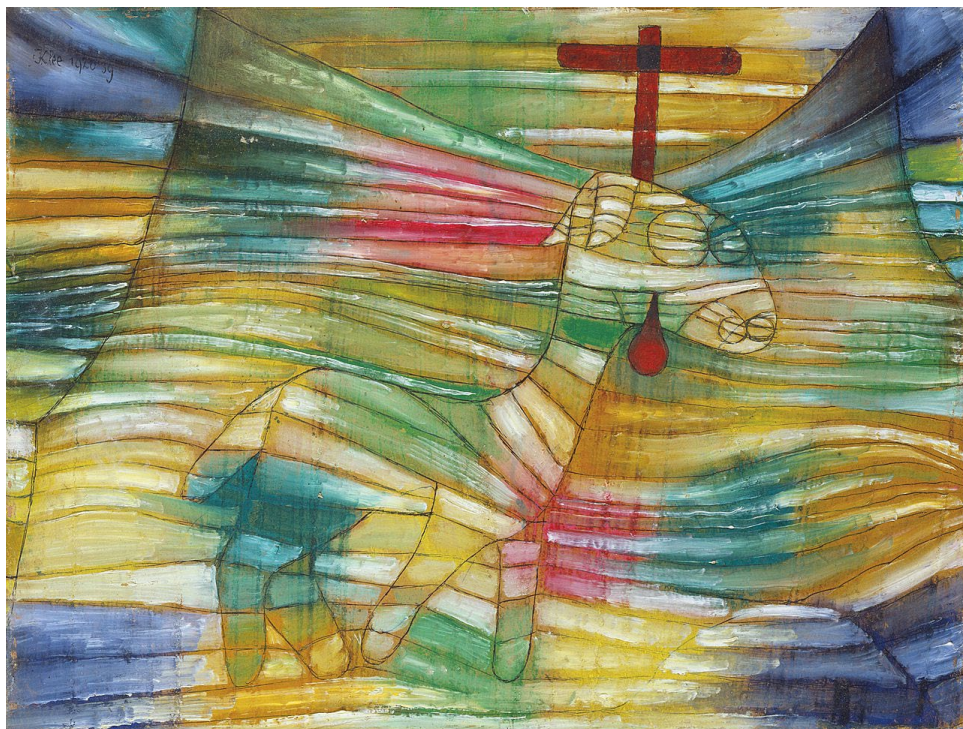

Many ways to give! We welcome your offering in the way that works for you: by cash or cheque in the offering plates, through automatic monthly gifts via Pre-Authorized Remittance (contact the office to enrol), by free eTransfer from your bank (to cloverdalepastoralcharge@gmail.com), or by credit card via CanadaHelps (service fees apply). Children are welcome at all services! It is important for families to worship together. Don't feel your child must be absolutely quiet or still, for we are glad to have children—and all their wiggles, giggles, and squiggles—as part of our community and worship life! After all... as an old saying goes, “faith is caught, not taught!” Children are encouraged to stand and sing with the songs, partake in communion, read and pray along when they can, and join in for the “Early Word”—a time at the front with conversation just for them near the beginning of the service. Most Sundays September through June, we have “Children’s Church” activities during the latter two-thirds of the service in the Lounge on the lower level, to which any pre-school through grade 5 aged child is welcome! For those accompanying infants or toddlers who need a spot to ‘escape’ to during the worship service, feel free to make use of the “**Quiet Room**” off the side of the sanctuary, near the piano, where there you will find comfortable seating, toys, and a changing table all while being able to hear and see the worship service.



Recording and streaming in use: Please note that video cameras and microphones are capturing our worship services, and that the resulting content may be transmitted over Zoom, YouTube, or other platforms.

Likewise, from time to time still photography of our worship services may be taken and used for church communications, websites, and other uses. By your presence within the sanctuary, you are indicating your consent to the possibility that your likeness may be captured and used in any of these ways. While video capture of congregants in the pews is

relatively minimal, if you wish to guarantee you will not ever be depicted on video, the area at the rear centre of the pew seating area is unable to be picked up on camera.

Annual Meeting of the Community of Faith: February 1, 2026

In accordance with the provisions in section B.5 of the Bylaws of The United Church of Canada, found in The Manual_, 2025 edition...

All members of the Cloverdale United Church are hereby called to the Annual Meeting of the Community of Faith, to be held on the February 1, 2026, at approximately 11:45 am (following the Sunday morning worship service) in the CUC Lower Hall. The

agenda for the Annual Meeting includes reporting on the life of the Community of Faith over the past year, looking ahead at plans and visions for the coming year, approving the Church Council's proposed budget, electing new Church Council members or other officers, and other matters pertaining to the business and governance of our Community of Faith.

At least 20 full members of the congregation must be in attendance in order to conduct business. Adherents (regular participants in our congregation's life who have not [yet] become members) are also invited and encouraged to attend; we customarily vote to extend the privilege of participation and voting in the meeting to adherents when permitted.



For this year's meeting, we'll have the joy of gathering in fellowship over food, too, as the meeting will take place together with a **luncheon** prepared by congregants active with our community of faith's United Church Women unit.

Attendance and participation in the Annual Meeting will also be available for remote participants via Zoom, at the same Zoom link as is used for CUC worship services. (Alas, the luncheon aspect will only be available to in-person participants, as we have yet to figure out how to pass along food over Zoom Meetings... sorry!)

Materials and reports for the Annual Report covering 2025 should be submitted to Lily Lee, office administrator, no later than the end of the day **Monday, January 19** (in order to have annual report booklets ready for distribution on Sunday, January 25).

Save the Date – Haydn's "Seven Last Words" performance at CUC: Sunday, March 22, 2026, at 7:00 pm in the Sanctuary. Mark your calendars for a very special musical performance for the Lenten season. The sacred oratorio "The Seven Last Words of Christ from the Cross" by Joseph Haydn will be presented by professional-level soloists, choristers from Vancouver's Vivaldi Chamber Choir, and accompaniment by a double string quartet of professional-level instrumentalists, on Sunday, March 22nd, beginning at 7:00 pm. God's Mission, Our Gifts

Mountains of Service: If you ever travel to the northern mountains of India and meet a man named Surrender Singh, the first thing he'll do is invite you on a walk. Not a short stroll, but a real mountain trek. And the beauty of the Himalayas is only part of what he wants to show you.

With him as your guide, the trail becomes a story. Every bend holds a memory. Every village has a face he knows.

Many still call him "Singh san" from his time training at the Asian Rural Institute, a Mission and Service partner in Japan. For more than four decades, he has climbed these ridges. As you walk beside him, people call out greetings. He calls them by name. Someone brings tea. He digs in his pack and pulls out bananas or biscuits to share. And suddenly you're not just passing through—you're part of the conversation.

He'll point to a house and tell you how he once slept on the floor there while helping build a water pipeline with the Mussoorie Village Development Committee, the group he now leads. Another turn in the path, and he's showing you the school that has given local children a chance to learn close to home.

WELCOME TO CLOVERDALE UNITED CHURCH!

As we say at nearly every worship service, “No matter who you are, or where you are on life’s journey God welcomes you... and so do we.” We take these words seriously. We strive to be a community as diverse and hospitable as God’s kingdom. We don’t all look or act alike; God knows we don’t all think alike. We don’t all read the Bible the same way. We come from different religious backgrounds, we bring different questions, and we carry different burdens. But every Sunday, we gather and worship God together as one.



In this lovely old church, we do Sunday morning in some fairly traditional ways. We study the teachings and the actions of Jesus. After the service, please stick around. Have a cup of coffee or a bite to eat with us. Introduce yourself to other worshippers or our pastor. There are plenty of opportunities here to feed your soul and expand your spirit. Try one out. You never know—you just might be home!
